Editorial Comment

Inflation Has To Stop

The federal government has to stop inflation if its pension program is going to work.

The spiralling cost of living is felt most by persons on fixed incomes with no chance of making the extra

money needed to live in today's society. The government itself should be showing leadership by shaving its spending. Taxes should be on a downward trend instead of inching upwards each year, which all

adds to the cost of living.

Canada cannot afford all the luxuries that its eighbor to the south enjoys because it has a lower standard of living and the U.S. is higher in productivity.

There is an indication that Prime Minister Trudeau is taking steps to slow the inflationary trend. In the recent settlement of the Air Canada strike an eight per cent gain by machinists indicates it is within guidelines, either

stated or implied, set by the federal government.

This shows guidelines can be applied to wage contracts and in turn should have a levelling off effect on the price of consumer goods.

In terms of wages the machinists gained only a fraction more than Air Canada offered before the strike began. The machinists, however, did gain extra cenefits such as the new principle of longevity pay.

Different ecomomists have made suggestions on how

to level off prices. Many of the suggestions have been tried, such as tight money schemes, but living costs continued to climb. Rising interest rates may have slowed but haven't stopped the trend.

If the federal government considers inflation as a national emergency and persists elsewhere in its avowed determination to end it maybe more positive results could be seen.

Self Discipline Needed

Motorcycling can be a clean sport that is enjoyed by old and young-alike. It is also a cheap mode of transportation. It seems, however, a few smart actors in a group has had the effect of lowering the character of motorcyclists in the eyes of the rest of the public.
