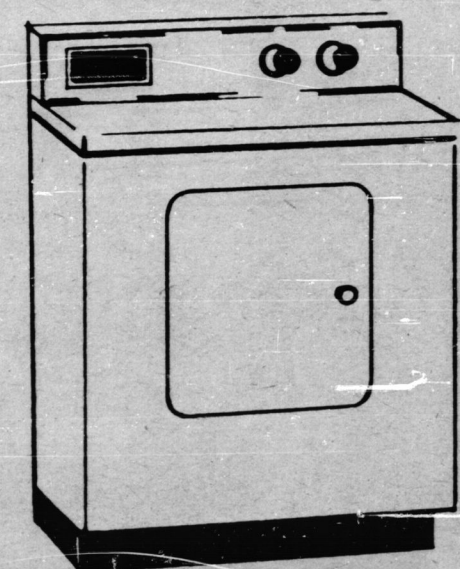

Let Contract

TORONTO — A contract for the reconstruction of Highway 24 in the Simcoe area has been announced by Highways Minister George E. Gomme.

The contract calls for the reconstruction and paving of Highway 24 from Highway 3 north for 2.3 miles. Included in the contract is a bridge over the Lynn River.

The successful contractor is Dagmar Construction Limited of Scarborough with a tender of \$911,574.71.

Work will be completed in two stages, starting in mid-June, 1969, and continuing until the end of November, 1969. It will commence again on May 1, 1970, with completion scheduled for September 30, 1970.
