New Association Formed In Norfolk County

A new Secondary School Athletic Association is being organized by principals and physical education teachers of the Secondary Schools of Norfolk County.

The association will provide for inter-school competition in a wide variety of sports including football, basketball, track and field, volleyball and soccer.

The Council advises the motorist to slow down then encountering sideways which cause control problems when they hit the trailer broadside.

The treads of the trailer tires also have to be checked. Bald tires are subject to skidding on greasy or wet roads. They can aquaplane on a slippery road surface just like water skiers if the treads are worn out.

For safety's sake, the driver should never forget that he's towing a trailer, the Council says.
