Free Auto Safety Check

In an effort to help eliminate mechanical problems and traffic tie-ups this winter, the Hamilton Automobile Club will launch its Annual Free Vehicle Inspection and Pre-Winter Check-Up Program.

Prince Philip is evidently a man who thinks seriously about serious things - and is not afraid to speak out. Recently he was in Canada to present "Duke of Edinburgh Awards" to students who have shown good all round development.

Sheridan Park is an area set aside for research work in various fields by scientists, each working for their own employer (usually a big corporation). Being grouped together they can have fellowship with each other and perhaps share a few ideas.

The Prince told this group of scientists that it is time that they began taking the quality of life into consideration in their search for facts.

He objected to the tendency of scientists to dismiss the accumulated experience of civilization "merely because it looks in some cases to be irrational."

Here is what he said, after remarking that the progress of civilization is not simply a matter of improving the material environment.

He also said, "The central concern of this world, which is the quality of existence, is the inter-relationship between all living beings."

The central concern of this world is not the ability to make trainloads of poison gas, nor is it the ability to put a man on the moon. It is not being able to perform a successful heart transplant or to build faster and more deadly automobiles.

The central concern is surely the achievement of peace, security, comfort and happiness for all the people on earth. This cannot be achieved by science alone, though science may make the achievement of such a dream more possible.

Cold, pure science has its place, I think in the foundation, but on this the spirit of man must build, and in so doing be very largely influenced by what man has done in the past, by knowledge of the heights to which the human spirit can soar in literature, music and the arts.

In the words of Prince Philip, we need to consider the quality of life as well as scientific development.

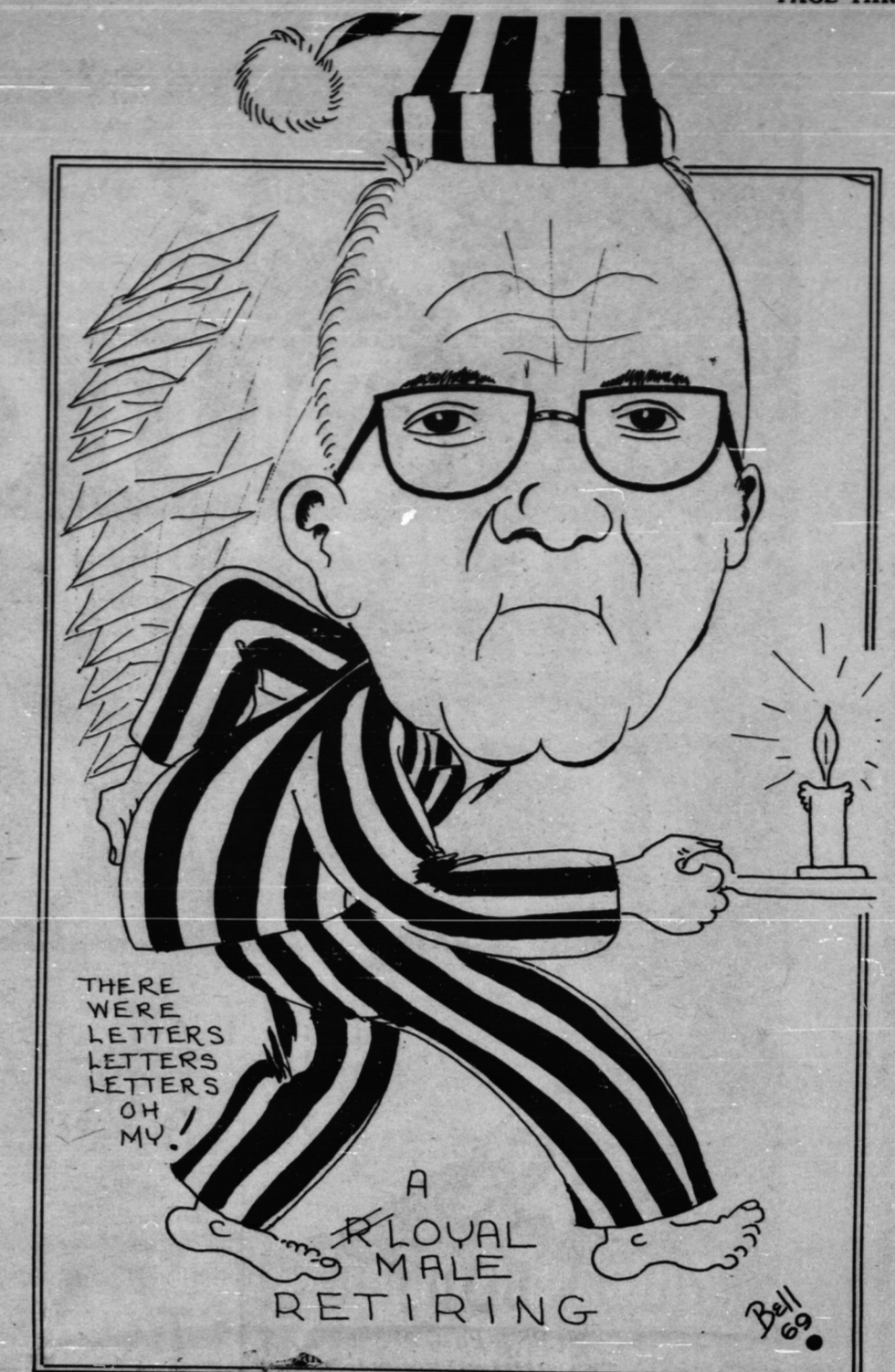
