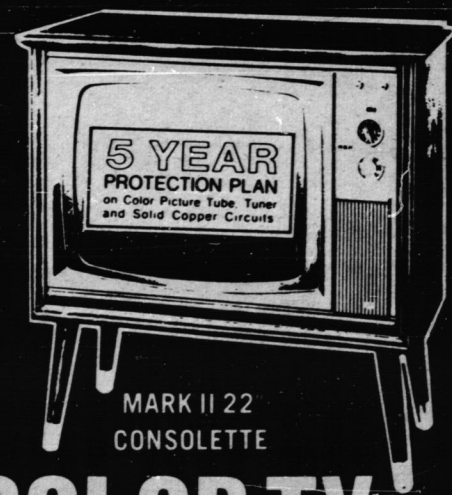

Last year Ross Gee took a similar interest in eradicating Buckthorn in the Fisherville area. Buckthorn is a bush that grows as alternate host for crown rust of oats. As alternate host, it serves to greatly multiply the number of spores that are ready in spring to infect the new crop. Eliminating Buckthorn reduces the rust problem.

This time of year is one of the better times to control Buckthorn mainly because the dark green leaves remain on this bush longer than other such bushes. It can be seen at a distance and only requires checking for the purple coloured berries that will positively identify it.

The county Weed Inspector, Joe Shannon, R.R. 1, York, has been most anxious to co-operate with property owners who are interested in this project.

The Haldimand Farm Safety Council president, Grant Temple, would be most anxious to hear from any safety minded Haldimand residents who would like to take part in the regional Farm Safety Conference to be held at the Rural Youth and Agricultural Centre, Kohler, commencing with registration at 10 a.m., Nov. 18.

The 4-H Awards Night, Nov. 22, will wind up season for members of agricultural clubs for 1969. As well as the 4-H members, parents and relatives will be on hand for this event. All other interested persons would be welcome too.

The 1970 Performance Testing Policy for Sheep is available for any Ontario Sheep Breeder with 20 or more ewes. Reports resulting from the testing program would provide useful information on the performance of ewes and lambs in the flock. Application for enrolment should be made to the Livestock Commissioner, Ontario Department of Agriculture and Food, Toronto.
