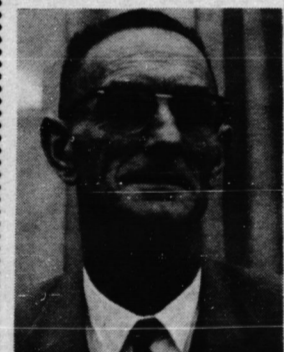

Virus Tested Trees Available For 1970

A limited supply of apple trees from virus-tested sources is available for the 1970 growing season from several Ontario nurseries. The Horticultural Research Institute of Ontario, a branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture and Food, lists as available the following varieties:

Cortland VC 307; Delicious (Starking) VC 304; Golden Delicious VC 449; Golden Delicious VC Halcomb; Jonathan VC 237; McIntosh (Double Red) VC 309; Spartan VC 146; Wealthy (Double Red) VC 310; Wellington VC 178. Dr. Aleck Hutchinson, research scientist with the institute, said that one-year-old trees that will produce fruit of a good color and size will be available for growers this fall and early next spring. The apple budwood program, begun in 1958, is aimed at upgrading the quality of trees in Ontario orchards.
