Aubrey Falls

Ontario Hydro's newest generating station, Aubrey Falls on the Mississagi River, north of Thessalon, produced first power September 30, when one of its twin generators was initially loaded to capacity. The second unit is expected to produce its first power later in October.

The \$32.6 million plant, 45 miles northwest of Elliot Lake, is Hydro's 68th hydraulic station. It will have a capacity of 130,200 kilowatts and when in full operation, produce enough power to meet the combined peak demands of cities the size of Sudbury and North Bay.

Two additional hydraulic stations are under construction as Hydro continues to utilize, wherever economically possible, the energy resources of the province's swift-flowing rivers and waterfalls.
