Impact Of Industrial Subsidization
 TORONTO - A project report on the impact of Ontario's Equalization of Industrial Opportunity Program, released today by Trade and Development Minister Stanley J. Randall, says that government incentives to industry have resulted in capital investment 4.5 times the amount of the grants and that tax revenues from participating industry will pay back the grants in full.

The report by management consultants Stevenson and Kellogg, Ltd., covering phase one of the EIO program from Nov. 1, 1967, to June 30, 1969, and projected for two years when all phase one programs are to be completed, states that 7,200 jobs will be created, with an annual payroll of \$38,800,000.

Sales of companies receiving grants will total \$217,000,000 - 8.7 times the total grants. Capital investment in the EIO projects will total \$111,000,000 - 4.5 times the total grants.

The report says the EIO program, operated by the Ontario Development Corporation, has expanded Ontario's industrial base by introducing new processes to the province and producing goods never before manufactured in Ontario.

"In two years, new processes will result in sales totaling \$84,000,000 annually," the report says. "At the same time, products never before produced in Ontario will sell for \$110,000,000."
