To Represent Board Of Education

SIMCOE — Ivan Lamb, Education council principal of the Delhi District Secondary School, was appointed to represent the Norfolk County Board of Education on the Ontario Institute of Studies and

Mr. Bristow also stated in his report that school was suggested by Dudley Bristow, Director of Education for the Norfolk Board, in his report to the 4,024 secondary school

students and 45 students attending the Simcoe Lions School for Retarded Children.

The Norfolk County Board of Education, in the course of its meeting, decided to purchase four acres of land at a cost of \$19,000 in order to build another elementary school at Simcoe. The proposed school will not be built for at least two to four years.

Issued 18 warnings and 42 charges to motorists for various infractions of the Highway Traffic Act. A Liquor Control Act investigation resulted in one person being charged.
