assistant director of the Haldimand-Norfolk study, is discussing merits of the incinerator with Municipal Affairs Minister Darcy McKeough and George Kerr, minister of energy and mines resources which governs air pollution.
Air pollution officials have given most Haldimand municipalities a deadline to stop open burning of garbage in dumps.
However, Cayuga Reeve Ted Powell said that a result of Mr. Grove's meeting with the two ministers might possibly be a relaxation of the time limits to give council adequate opportunity to fulfil its project.
Rainham Reeve Clare Kindy said he wonders if a rural township could afford garbage pickup costs on the scale of urban municipalities. Caledonia pays about \$10,000 a year for straight collection.

Fertilizing Greenhouse Vegetables
Intensive and properly balanced fertilization is essential for maximum yields and high quality in greenhouse tomato and cucumber crops.
