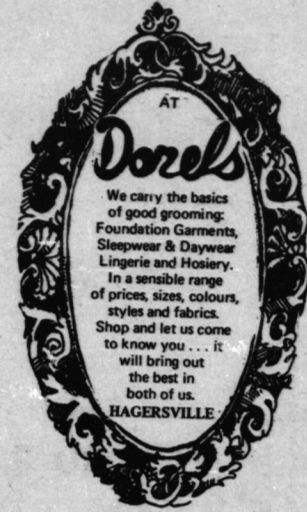

Coho Salmon Return To Many Parts of Ontario

Coho salmon are making their presence known in many parts of the Province. The 8-10" smolts stocked in the Humber, Credit and Bronte rivers of Lake Ontario and in the Gravel and Jackpine rivers tributary to Lake Superior, should be moving back into the streams shortly. Only a small run of precocious "jacks" (males which become sexually mature earlier than usual) is expected. The main spawning migration won't occur until the fall of 1970, however, this fall's run will be a precursor of things to come. During the summer between 40 and 50 coho have been taken in eastern Lake Ontario by the sports and commercial fisheries there. Most of these were heavily scarred by lamprey, some as many as nine times. An average of four to five lamprey scars were recorded on those fish examined by Department staff. One fish even had four lamprey attached when caught! More recently department of lands and forests staff have

Unfortunately, a number of male coho in the Humber were destroyed as a result of some suspected toxic substance in the river, which killed a number of species of fish. The fish kill is being investigated by the Ontario Water Resources Commission as well as department officers. Reports from Lake Superior are confused since in addition to coho, pink salmon introduced over 12 years ago seem to be making a new appearance in the Steel, Salmon, McGuiness and Jackpine rivers. One report suggests between 150 - 200 "pinks" or humpbacks in the Steel river. Lands and forests staff will be checking salmon this fall in the river mouths and rivers to determine their general condition and obtain data of use in assessing the experimental plantings made last spring and planned for 1970.
