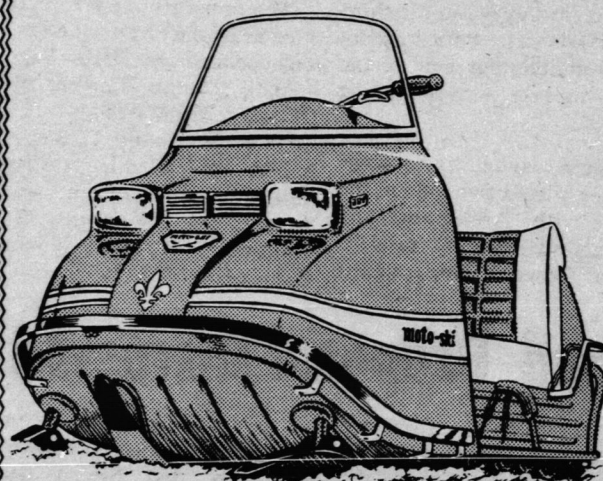

A wedding reception for the immediate families was held at the home of the bride's sister.

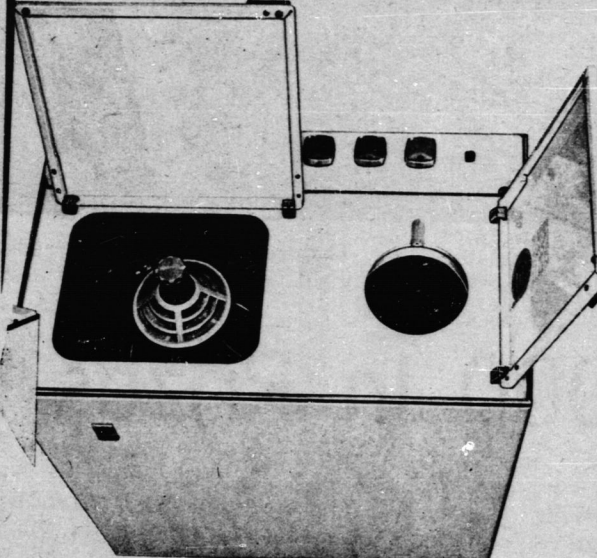

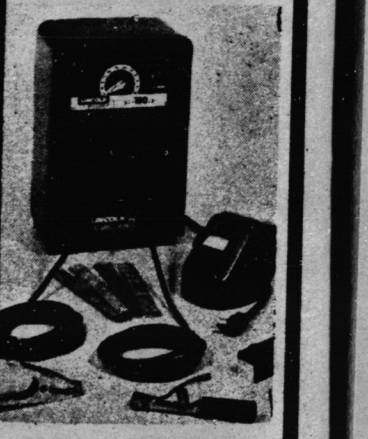

Editorial Comment

There Is A Time To Quit

There is no substitute for winning, but neither is there any graceful substitute for realizing that one cannot go on winning forever.

From this simple philosophy embraced by Rocky Marciano, not merely athletes but the whole world could learn much.

The Brocton, Mass., former world's heavyweight champion, had won 49 times, grossed more than \$1.7 million and looked unbeatable when he decided to retire in 1956. The temptations to try for a comeback, up to six years after shelving the gloves, were enormous. But Rocky, killed in a plane accident Sept. 7, stuck to his retirement plan.

The pathetic result of chasing departed glories in the boxing ring were painfully illustrated by the failures of Ezzard Charles and Joe Louis, former heavyweight champions, to make successful comebacks.

In military strategy, neither Napoleon nor Hitler knew when to quit. Napoleon, not content with his many conquests, was turned back in Russia and later "met his Waterloo," the ultimate fate of those who overreach. An insane ambition drove Adolph Hitler to his ultimate ruin.

As for misjudging one's abilities, Ulysses Grant, a victorious general of the U.S. civil war, took on more than he could handle when he flopped miserably as a U.S. president. The indignities of trying too hard were never more sadly depicted than Prime Minister Pearson's continuing failure to be a good administrator in his efforts to get legislation through the house.

If anyone reads into this, the faintest praise of a quitter, he misses the lesson of Mr. Marciano: The moral is that discretion if the better part of valor. By leaving his impressive record intact, Rocky Marciano, was able to command respect never achieved by has-beens that try to make a comeback.

On The Farm Front

Thursday, September 18th, is the closing date for entries in the Market Hog Special Feature at Caledonia Fair. Four hogs from one litter would be entered with one to be forwarded on September 24th for slaughter so that it can be displayed at the fair on Saturday, September 27th. The remaining 3 hogs in each entry are also shown on that date after which they are forwarded for slaughter and scoring.

Entry date for the Haldimand Black and White Show is September 15th. Holsteins, Ayrshires, Guernseys and Jerseys will show on Friday, September 26th. Beef and Dual Purpose Shortorns show on Saturday the 27th.

Exhibitors of Exhibition Hall entries are reminded that this year entries will be placed in the hall from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 24th with judging to be completed and the hall open on Thursday afternoon. All 4-H classes will be shown on Thursday, September 25th.

The critical date for alfalfa winterkill is about September 25th. Avoiding cutting or pasturing during the three weeks before and after that date is most likely to reduce winterkill.

The use of chemicals has been very much in the news over the past weeks. Pesticide pollution is a real possibility. Byron Beeler, Director of the Soils and Crops Branch says: "I firmly believe that our producers have done an excellent job in using pesticides only when required and in a safe manner." He does feel, however, that misuse of chemicals by one person can have a serious reflection on all agricultural producers. All farmers are asked to be on the alert for any changes in legislation that will affect future use of pesticides.
