Merchants Bow To St. Catharines

The Jarvis Merchants went down to defeat on Friday night when they dropped the final game of the O.A.S.A. Intermediate A Zone Two Championship to St. Catharines last Monday night. After winning the first game in a hard-fought 1-0 thriller in Jarvis, the Merchants were on the losing end of a protest fiasco at St. Catharines last Monday night. Leading by two runs in the sixth inning, the umpire called a balk on John Edwards and advanced runners. Although the umpire admitted his error and the 7-6 win for St. Catharines was
