**Tobacco Farm**

**Just West Of Jarvis**

W. Scott Miller owns the most easterly tobacco farm in Southwestern Ontario.

The farm, which has a basic acreage of 22.25 acres, is located on Highway 3 about two miles west of Jarvis. This is about six miles east of fringe area for tobacco farms just east of Simcoe.

Mr. Scott told The Record that he has grown 11 crops on the farm along with many general crops such as corn and grain. He also keeps about 30 breeder sows and some beef cattle. Usually about 20 head of beef cattle, he said.

All this is surrounded by mostly general farms that produce livestock, grains and corn.

Mr. Scott said that he has used the variety Delhi 34 last season and has found he gets good success with this in his black loamy land that is similar to land found in the high-yield producing area of Burford.

Mr. Scott said his yields are continuing to climb and was better than 1,700 pounds an acre last year.

Mr. Scott grew tobacco in the Simcoe area before purchasing his present farm.

Grow A Plot of Pot

Flue-tobacco growers take heart. There may be a cash crop diversification coming that will keep the economy of the area going.

With all the push and propagand on to get rid of the tobacco industry, a new crop to take its place may be the answer to many growers who are wondering "what do we do now?"

The Canadian Home and School and Parent-Teacher Federation may have come up with the solution.

This group has made a bid to ease the laws governing marijuana under the Food and Drug Act instead of the Narcotics Control Act.

Now it just may be that the marijuana puffers will be allowed to stroll the streets perfectly legal while the faithful to tobacco may have to sneak behind the fluffers for a drag. The Mounties will be taping the conversations in the Ontario Flue-Cured Tobacco Growers' Marketing Board
