Dear Mr. A.G.I.: The decision to buy now or wait until later depends largely on the condition of your present second car. Can it last a few more months? Now is an excellent time to shop for a car before the new models are introduced in the fall, but those new sub-compacts you referred to may be worth waiting for.

The U.S. sub-compacts will be slightly bigger and heavier than their foreign competitors, and slightly more expensive. Still, the American auto makers know how we've all been caught in the inflation squeeze lately and prices will be kept in the \$2,000 range. The new breed of cars offer several advantages, such as do-it-yourself maintenance. You'll find it easy to change spark plugs, and adjust the carburetor, choke, and headlight for instance. You'll also be able to simply snap out such parts as radios and heaters in some models and leave them with the repairman. Annual model changes will be minimized, too, so your 1971 car will look just about like its successors in the years to come. Aside from the low sticker prices on the new sub-compacts, there's another way to save money when it comes time to buy. This applies to cars of all sizes. Have your financing settled in advance. Salesmen will be more apt to bargain if you have the money "on hand." You'll have a much better chance of getting a really "good deal" from the dealer, especially in today's "buyers market." You should also compare all the models, and let each dealer know you are making comparisons. After you have all the bids, study them carefully as to the ones that will suit your needs best. Narrow them down to two or three that you would like to have and return to the dealers for his best price. After that it's simply a matter of going to the lender you made the pre-arrangement with and picking up your check and presenting it to the dealer. All the paperwork and approvals will already be complete and you'll have no delay. Automobile loans are available from all the usual sources such as banks, savings and loan associations, credit unions, and consumer finance companies. Just like you'll compare those new automotive models, compare the financing. You'll find there's quite a difference in rates and service - both of which are important.
