**Peach Of A Pie**  
 This peach pie recipe, suggested by home economists, College of Family and Consumer Studies, University of Guelph, uses a simple rolled oat crust. To remove the skins from the peaches, plunge a few at a time into boiling water for 1/2 to 1 minute. Dip immediately into cold water and remove skins.  
**Quick Peach Pie - Crust:**  
 1 cup pastry flour, 1/8 tsp. salt, 1/3 cup brown sugar, 1/4 tsp. cinnamon, 3/4 cup rolled oats, 1/3 cup butter.  
 1. Combine all dry ingredients.  
 2. Cut in butter, until mixture is crumbly.  
 3. Reserve 1/3 cup of mixture to sprinkle on top of pie. Trimly press remaining crumbs into buttered 9-inch pie plate.  
**Filling:** 1/3 cup cinnamon sugar mixture, 1 egg, 1 cup sour cream, 1 tsp. lemon juice, 1 tsp. lemon rind, fresh peach halves, peeled.  
 1. Beat first five ingredients until smooth.  
 2. Blanch peaches; peel, halve and remove pit. Arrange halves in crust.  
 3. Pour cream mixture over peaches. Sprinkle with crumbs.  
 4. Bake at 375 degrees F. for 30 to 40 minutes. Serves 6.

Underripe or overripe fruit will not produce a good quality frozen product.

To blanch the peaches, place a few at a time in a wire basket and plunge into boiling water for 1/2 to 1 minute. Dip immediately into cold water and remove skins. Cut into halves; remove pits. To prevent fruit from browning, immerse in a weak brine - 1 teaspoon salt to 1 quart water.

Remove each peach from brine; using a stainless steel knife, slice into a thin syrup mixture - 1 cup sugar to 2 cups water. To prevent browning of fruit on de-frosting, add 1/8 teaspoon powdered ascorbic acid or 400 milligrams in tablet form. For a commercial preparation use as directed on package. Sprinkle powder or dissolved tablet over peaches. Mix the fruit and syrup mixture well. Pack in freezer containers, making sure the fruit is covered with syrup. Leave 1/2-inch headspace and put a small crumpled piece of wax paper on top of the fruit to keep it down in the wrap. Cover and quick-freeze. Store at 0 degrees F. or lower.
