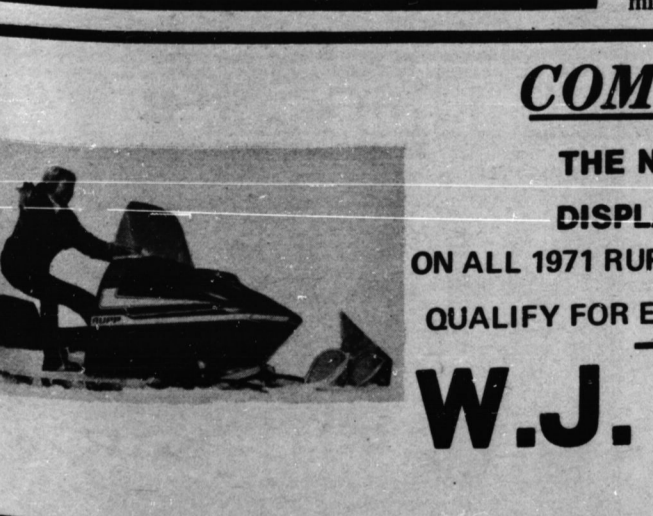

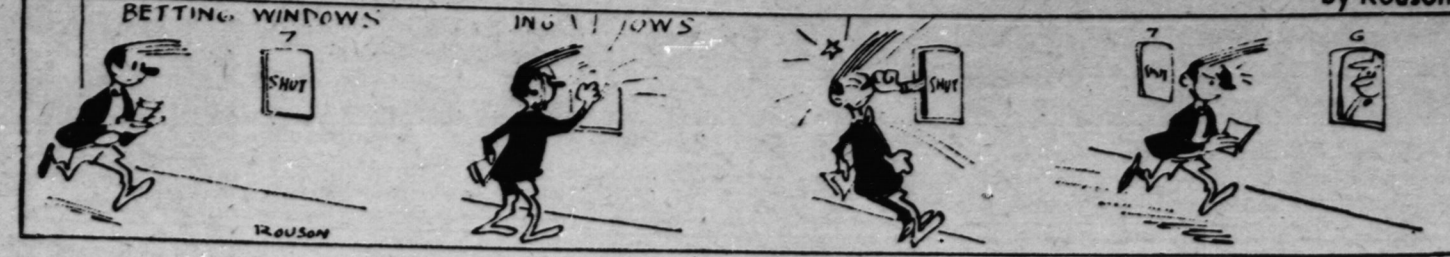

tablespoons sugar, 1 teaspoon dry mustard, 2/3 cup vinegar, 2/3 cup water, 1 teaspoon salt, dash pepper, 4 large new potatoes, pared cooked and sliced, 4 hard cooked eggs, 1/2 cup chopped green onions and tops.

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Fry 1-inch bacon pieces until crisp, drain off fat, set bacon aside. Combine 1/3 cup bacon fat, flour, sugar and mustard in medium saucepan. Stir until smooth. Add vinegar and water. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until thickened, remove from heat.

Stir in salt and pepper, arrange half the hot potatoes and sliced eggs in shallow baking dish. Sprinkle with half the celery, green onions and bacon. Pour over half the dressing. Repeat with remaining ingredients. Heat 25 minutes in oven or until heated through. Serves 6.

Mexican Salad: Another Hearty salad is served chilled.

It calls for: 1 can (about 1 pound) red kidney beans, 2 cups diced, peeled cucumber, 1 1/2 cups diced tomatoes, 1/2 cup diced green pepper, 1/2 cup chopped green onion, 1/2 cup chopped celery, salt and pepper, 1 cup of mayonnaise, lettuce.

Drain kidney beans and mix with cucumbers, tomatoes, pepper onions, celery, salt and pepper. Add mayonnaise and mix well. Refrigerate and serve chilled. At serving time, line bowl with lettuce leaves and fill with salad. Makes 8 servings.

For a variation, try a teaspoon of chili or curry powder added to the mayonnaise.

Cesar Salad: Another summer salad suggested by the Ontario department of agriculture is a variation on the Caesar salad.

It calls for: 1 egg, 1 clove garlic, 2 large cucumbers peeled and diced, 1 cup dairy sour cream, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon melted butter, pepper, juice of 2 lemons, 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, 1 cup croutons, 2 large heads romaine or other lettuce.

Soft-cook the egg for 1 minute. Set aside. Rub the bowl well with garlic, break up romaine lettuce into bowl. Add cucumber and

sour cream mixed with salt, butter, pepper and the soft-cooked egg. Squeeze the lemon juice on top, add the cheese and mix well. Just before serving, put in the croutons and toss gently. Makes 6 servings.
