**Alice Patterson Blight**  
Alice Patterson Blight passed away in Westman Hospital in Hagersville on Monday, August 10, 1970, aged 86.

late Mrs. Blight was a pioneer of the Pattersons, one of the three settlers in a Western Erie township. Only she and the St. Thomas

paper in writing of a historical bus trip showed the picture of a group signing the register in the Patterson homestead where Mrs. Blight had been born.

She had resided in Jarvis for more than 50 years, where her husband the late Alfred Samuel Blight, who predeceased her, operated the Norfolk Co-operative Mill. She was also pre-deceased by her son

Leslie who lost his life in the Air Force during World War II. She is survived by her son Gordon of Waterdown, three granddaughters and her stepson Arthur B. Blight of Jarvis, also two brothers Leslie Patterson, Saginaw, Mich., and George Patterson of Braham, Minnesota.

Mrs. Blight took an active part in the work of Wesley United Church. She was very active in the work of the local Red Cross from its earliest organization in Jarvis holding the office of president and remaining on the executive until the time of her death. She will be missed by many friends and neighbours who enjoyed her cheery personality. She was up and around in her garden during the early spring, taking pride in her yard and refusing to remain within while the flowers and grounds were being readied for the summer season.

The funeral was largely attended in Wesley United Church where the Rev. G. Taylor-Munro of Knox Church conducted the service in the absence of the Rev. Eric Ramrattan, incumbent.

Interment was in the adjoining cemetery. Pall Bearers were Fred Reicheld, George Walker, Robert Lysch, James Duxbury, Lloyd Chisholm, Ivar Smeiser.
