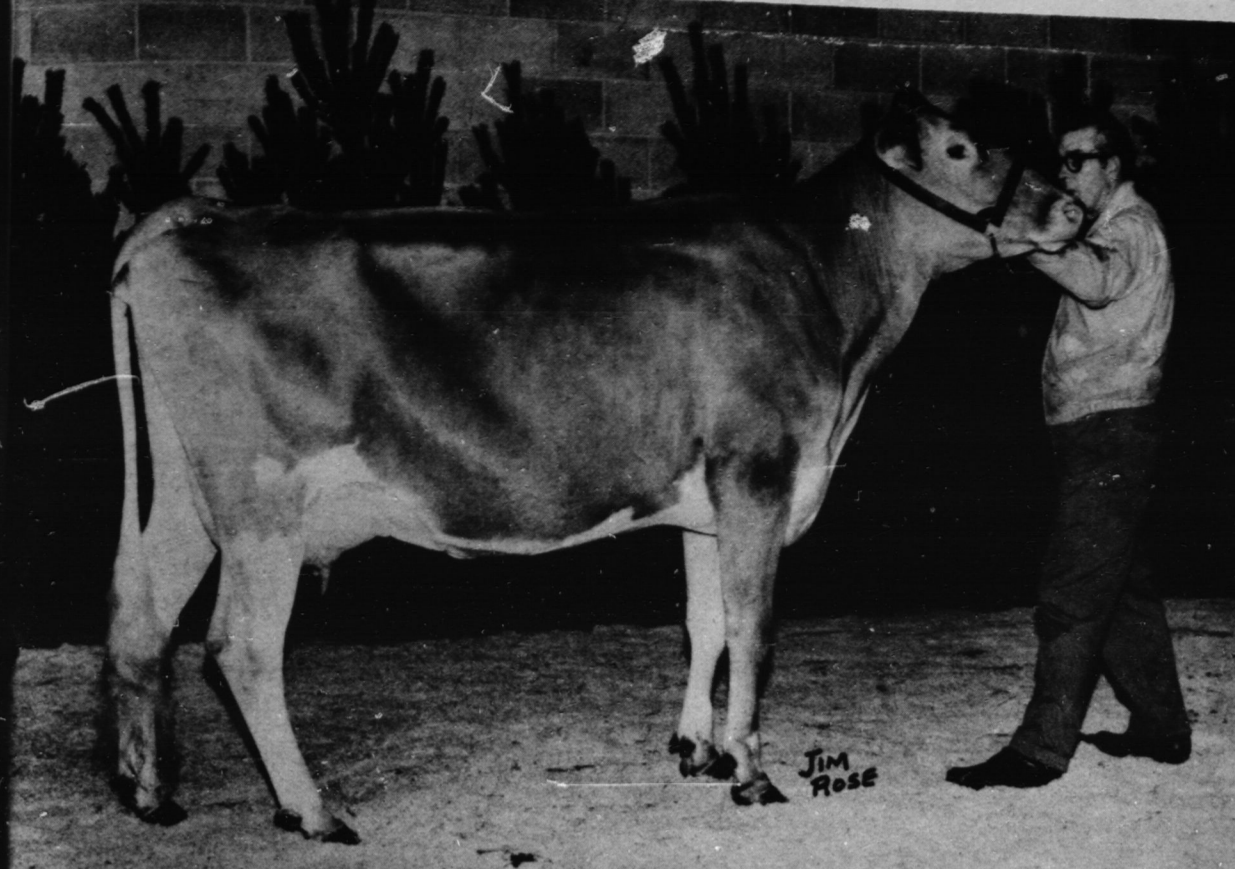

On The Farm Front

The latest dollar reference guide to dairy selection is now available. All dairymen interested in a profitable enterprise should have a copy. They are invited to call for one at the county agricultural office.

Results in the various yield competitions suggest that when it comes to planting time not a minute can be wasted. Presently the best money could be made by planting done by May 16. Planting corn after the ending May 16 was better than the week before by several bushels per acre. But corn planted after May 16 dropped sharply in yield on the farm.

The best time for planting barley in 1970 was during the interval April 10 - 18. Later seeded barley averaged 10 bushels per acre less. A similar best planting date occurred with soybeans this year too. The last week in May was much better than the first week in June.

In all of the cases planting date appeared to have more effect on yield than any other practice including amount of fertility applied. In other words, those who planted earlier used less fertilizer but got higher average yields than those who used more fertilizer but planted late.

* Western Ontario Breeders hold their Haldimand meeting at Kohler on Wednesday, Dec. 9.

The first shipment of Holstein cattle from Canada to Belgium has left Toronto by air. Consisting of 54 animals, largely bred heifers, they were consigned in lots of from two to 15, to seven different breeders in Belgium.

These seed stock Holsteins were designed to improve the milk producing qualities of Belgian cattle. They were selected and shipped by Rockwood International Livestock Co., of Georgetown, Ontario.

Along with the shipment went 300 vials of frozen semen from the plus proven Canadian Holstein sire, Forest Lee Rockette Centurion, owned by Western Ontario Breeders artificial breeding stud at Woodstock, Ontario.

Canadian Holsteins have now been shipped to 51 different countries in the world further bolstering Canada's position as the leading exporter of seed stock Holsteins in the world.
