He said that because the country was faced with strong inflationary pressures when he took office in 1968 the government was forced to take steps including tight fiscal measures to overcome the inflation spiral and bring the country back to an actual GNP gain.

Mr. Benson said the provinces - to a degree had co-operated in the fight to end inflation in Canada.

"People were asked to take less out of the economy as well as government reductions in spending and other severe

Mr. Benson said the move to put a little more back in the economy has cost the government a forecast surplus of \$250 million and will instead bring a deficit of \$350 million.

He told the meeting the government didn't decrease taxes at this time because the government doesn't want higher interest rates. If there was a higher interest rate than that of the US it would probably bring a higher inflow of foreign money or allow the exchange rate to be forced

"I don't want to see either - that's why we didn't reduce taxes at this

time," he said. He contended the ouldn't have made its inflation policy a success without putting fiscal pressure on the

"We have done much better in the fight than the United States with a 3 percent inflationary reduction compared with 5.7 percent there.

"If I find the inflationary spiral moving back we will take immediate steps to stop it," he said. Mr. Benson based his prediction of a better economy over the months ahead on the slowing of
