itself with all types of insurance, particularly for rural people. Members on the committee include, Ken Anderson, Grant Temple and Orlin Rittenhouse, chairman of Haldimand Branch of UCO. Properties is one of the most active committees and Otto Crane is again chairman. Committee members are George

Ramsey, Orlin Rittenhouse and Jim Louks. They promised to continue efforts to help Haldimand farmers get more just compensation for property. Rural development and land use planning is on the minds of many farmers. This committee is headed by Bill Creighton who will no doubt be very active again this year. Committee members are Wayne

Etinger, Maurice Yager, Bert Stam and Ralph Gowen. Pollution and decisions made by control authorities have already seriously affected Haldimand farmers and are certain to become an even greater concern. Earl Deamude and Jim Mitchell. The committee will assist farmers with these problems. The OFA has been asked to deal with the provincial sales tax.
