How To Warm A Cold Room

Is there one room in your house which is persistently cold although the rest of the house is comfortable? If so,

you don't need the Canadian Hydronics Council to tell you that you have a "cold room" problem, but the Council does have some suggestions which may help you in finding a cure.

Before you call in a heating contractor, make sure that all the heating units in the room are working. If it is a hydronic (modern hot water) system, there may be air in that section of baseboard panel. This is easy to fix. Find the nearest air vent (in newer homes they are usually located at the boiler), and after turning up your thermostat, open the vent until water escapes. This will solve the problem.

In warm air systems, the damper in the register may be closed or clogged. This requires a good cleaning.

If you have electric heat, the unit may not be working because of faulty wiring or because the thermostat may not be very sensitive to changes in the temperature.

If the heating units in the cold room are in good working order, the Council suggests that you find out if they are capable of handling the heat loss in this room. Unless you know how to calculate heat loss accurately, it will be best to call in a heating contractor.

Simcoe Chamber Of Commerce Offers To Buy Old Post Office

Simcoe's original Post Office building, for many years the Law Office of McKay and Innes on Kent Street, South, has been optioned by the Simcoe Chamber of Commerce. Wm. B. Jackson, president, said that the purchase will be completed on Feb. 1, 1971 if satisfactory financial arrangements can be made.

The first site of this building was on the north-east corner of Norfolk and Argyle Streets, where Budd's Store is at present. Simcoe's first Postmaster, Mr. Duncan Campbell, commenced operations from there in 1829 and Mr. Jackson said that because of the historical significance the Chamber would like to purchase and preserve the building for the community. The Chamber has been

looking for a permanent office site and both the building and location would be ideal for their needs.

The Chamber does not have sufficient funds to undertake this project on an outright purchase and support from government agencies or others will be required. The building will require considerable restoration and refurbishing for Chamber activities; also a suitable plaque should be placed on the premises to outline its past history, marking this another asset to the town of Simcoe.

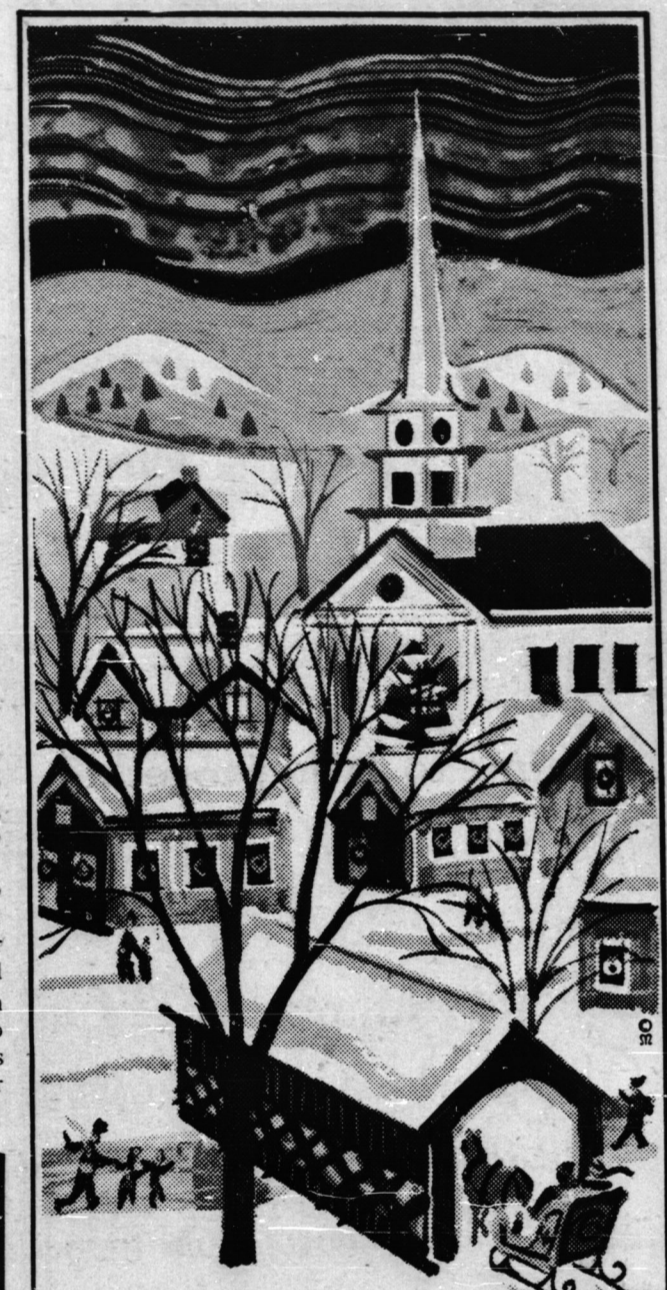
