

## Hears Proposal For Museum

Mr. and Mrs. Carroll Lindsay invited a group of Haldimand Citizens to their home on Tuesday afternoon January 22 to meet V. N. Styrmo, Museum advisor, Historical Branch, Parliament Buildings, Toronto.

Mrs. Lindsay served a desert luncheon upon Mr. Styrmo's arrival, after which all present made a tour of the Lindsay Home from basement to attic with a view to hearing his comment on the suitability, possibility and manner of procedure by which this historic building might be preserved as a museum when Texaco moves in to establish a refinery in the area.

The visitor from Queen's park noted the wonderful construction of the Victorian Mansion built in 1878 on property, which had formerly been a Clergy Reserve. He noted that if the Department of Education could be interested a great step forward would be made.

As Texaco holds the option on the property it would be necessary to get their permission to retain the house and two acres of land as picnic and parking facilities. He cited a project of Hiram Walker Distilleries, which presented a Museum to the City of Windsor. The question arose whether Texaco might be persuaded to do the same in this case. The question of a "Green Belt" also came in relation to the location.

Blue prints were shown of the original building. These considerations will be taken into account when the plans of the refinery and its location are released. Revenue anticipated for the project would be 60 per cent from visitors. A study is now going on, proposing Haldimand and Norfolk be regionally joined. Hydro, Stelco and Texaco will likely be tied together as an Industrial Park. There might be some delay in establishment of the industrial area so that there is a possibility of Nanticoke being another Iroquois. The law states that five per cent of an industrial area be preserved as a green belt area.

TRURO, N.S. (CP) - A study of municipal taxation as it relates to the net income of commercial farmers in Nova Scotia has been released by the provincial department of agriculture here. The report is based on tax data collected for more than 3,000 commercial farmers.
