



year, in any year, within the limits of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis. By-Law 97 of the Village of Jarvis prohibits the firing of any gun, rifle, pistol or firearm of any kind on any public street, lane, alley or sidewalk or other public place

within the limits of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis. By-Law 293 of the Village of Jarvis being a By-Law to regulate the parking of motor vehicles in certain areas of the Village as clearly defined by posted signs provides a penalty of Two Dollars (\$2.00) for a contravention of the By-Law.
