"Sincerely we hope that we will never see that patient again," he said.

Mr. Van de Ven succeeds Christopher Paylor who was administrator since the hospital was opened in 1962.

He resigned in November charging that the hospital board was reluctant to back his administrative policy.

Discriminate Against Small Business

Liberal Leader Robert Nixon charged this week the provincial government with discrimination against small business in handing out loans through the Ontario Development Corporation.

In a speech to the Renfrew Rotary Club dealing with inflation and the small businessman, Mr. Nixon said, "The latest figures available show that in 1968 big companies received twice as much in loans as small businesses."

He added, "While the total figures for 1969 haven't yet been computed, the trend to overlook the smaller businesses employing less than 30, in favour of larger businesses appears to be repeating itself."

The Opposition Leader said, "The EIO policy must have a specific program for fostering small businesses providing them with as much money as larger companies receive. It seems to me that in divvying up the EIO funds in the present manner, the government is discriminating against the development of small business."

Mr. Nixon also called for the expansion of the categories of eligibility for grants under the program to include service industries which are ordinarily the prerogative of the small businessman, and which can contribute substantially to the development of an area, such as laundromats, printing services, retail stores and personal services."

Mr. Nixon said, "Grants could also be made to those engaged in primary industries, such as mining, logging, agriculture and fishing."

The Liberal Leader said, "In times such as these, when the economy and economic trends impede growth amongst small enterprises, the government must provide programs which will assist growth in areas of the province where economic development has been slow and in all segments of business."

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
