With the arrival of cold weather, anglers have commenced fishing through the ice in the Mitchell's Bay area of Lake St. Clair, Long Point Bay, Rondeau Bay and Pigeon Bay in Lake Erie. These areas soon become a beehive of activity with the arrival of winter as many residents and non-residents take up one of their favourite hobbies.

Lake Erie District provides some of the better winter fishing for perch, pike, walleye and smelt. In addition it is expected that some coho salmon will show up in the anglers' creel this winter.

Bait fish dealers are reported to have a good supply of emerald shiners on hand and sufficient numbers in storage to carry them throughout the season in most areas of the District.

Each year numerous anglers become stranded when they venture out on ice that is not of sufficient thickness to support vehicles. With the increase in the use of snow machines and other motorized vehicles, operators should take extra caution. In many areas taxi services are available and anglers should take advantage of this service whenever possible, as the operators are familiar with the area, having roads marked and the ice tested for safe driving.
