NELLES CORNERS, ONTARIO — Cam Gagliardi, the little guy from Lockport, NY, kept his little foot in his big Chevy engine Corvair Modified-Sportsman for 20 non-stop laps, to capture his first feature event of the season here at Cayuga Speedway Friday night.

Cam pressured early leader Ron Williams for eight laps, and in a perfect move, eased under Williams on lap nine, and was never headed. Billy Brainerd worked his way into the runner-up spot. Jammed up in a photo finish behind Brainerd was Roger and Merv Treichler, and Chuck Boos in fifth. Gagliardi missed a new 20 lap track record by less than one (1) MPH, with an average speed of 104.16 MPH.

In the crash-filled 15 lap Late-Model Main, Phil Edwards of Buffalo N.Y. outlasted the spinning leaders to win his third feature here for this season. Norm Forbes and Jim Laughing tangled dicing for the lead in the early stages, then Ralph Book, trying for the lead did a 500 foot spin down the main chute and ended against a light pole. Dave VanValkenburg finally ended in second, followed by Billy Daniels, Bob Reichel and Don Riffel.

The 20 lap Mini-Stox go was fast and furious, as winner Larry Anthony blew his engine as he took the checker 1/2 car length ahead of Jim Dunham. Doug Sutton was third, Billy Schmitt fourth, and Harold Cooper fifth.

Larry Glaser of Buffalo N.Y. topped the TQ midget 20 lapper, followed by Bruce Bolitsky, Lloyd Dempster, John Fitzgibbon, and Jim Young.

Gagliardi and Gordy Treichler took their Mod-Stox heats while the crafty Billy Rafter copped the consi.

Van Vanenkenburg and Edwards were qualifying winners, with Ken Cassel the consolation winner in the Late-Model events.

In the Mini-Stox heats, Hoover and Anthony were the victors, as Dunham spun in his qualifier and had to win the consi to qualify for the feature. Kuwabara, Glaser and Banyard were TQ winners.
