Shearing

Second shearing of formal deciduous hedges should be done now, say horticulturists with the Ontario Department of Agriculture and Food. If possible, shearing should be done during a period of dull weather, so that the freshly-cut tips aren't burnt by bright sunshine.

The best way to ensure level trimming is to stretch a cord along the hedge at the desired height. Care should be taken to shear indentations only lightly so that they can grow out to the level of the rest of the hedge. The sides should also be trimmed to maintain

The best shape for a hedge is somewhat wider at the base than at the top. If the hedge base becomes narrower than the top, not enough light gets through for proper basal growth. This usually results in a hedge that is thick at the top, but gradually becoming sparse and open near the


