## Federation News

The Ontario government has pushed farmers too far by unfairly taxing them so heavily for education.

Because of this, the members of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture have directed the executive to lead an urgent protest and ask farmers to hold back payment of their education tax.

A telegram has been sent to Roy Atkinson, President of the National Farmers' Union, urging him to have the N.F.U. Ontario Region support the Federation in this action.

The members emphasized that farmers must pay their taxes assessed for township and county services. It was explained that the unfair taxes lies with the Ontario government and local councillors should not be blamed for a situation they cannot control or change.

O.F.A. President Gordon Hill says this action could unite Ontario farmers in a common cause like never before.

"But farmers pay almost five-times in education tax what some people in higher income brackets are required to pay", he charges angrily.

He explains that he can no longer expect farmers to be reasonable and wait for a tax system change that is not coming. The Federation leader traces requests and complaints by farmers to the government about the education tax program to

An O.F.A. survey in Lambton County shows a doctor, dentist, lawyer and high school principal pay an average of \$192.30 for education tax. Six farmers in the same county pay an average of \$768.89 education tax. The Federation has permission to release the names of those persons surveyed if it is necessary.

Mr. Hill stresses that the incomes of farmers would be less than one quarter of those in some professional groups.
