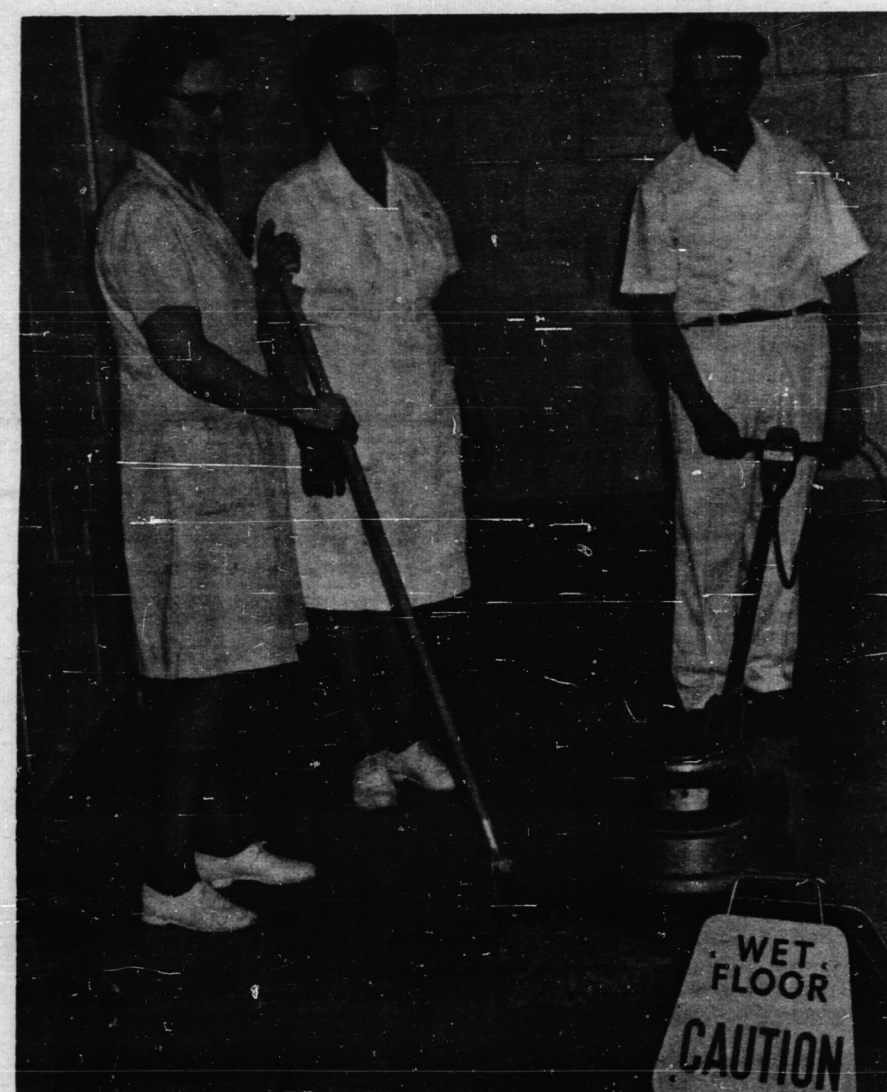

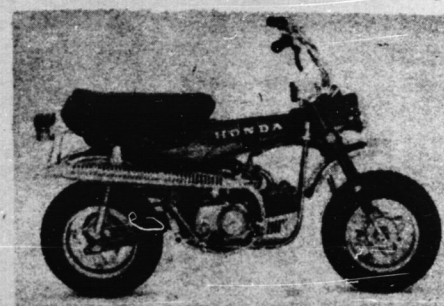

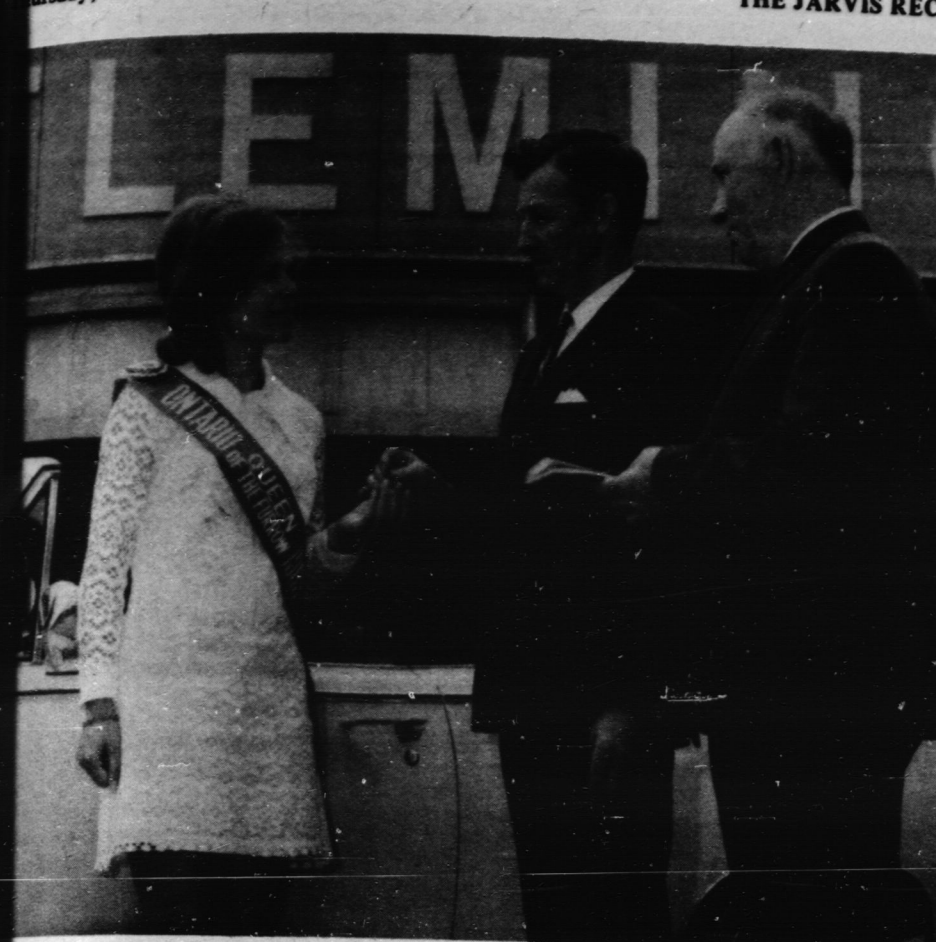

This reader is convinced there are people like myself who are thoroughly opposed to Bill 194. I would suggest to you, either go to the meeting or register your protest of Bill 194 by mail. We are all aware that this piece of legislation makes the Humane Society nothing more than a procurement agency for the researchers.

At the risk of sounding repetitious, I would like to offer this quote: "History seems to show that the powers of evil have won their greatest triumph by capturing the organizations that were formed to defeat them." Personally I would rather see the Animals put to sleep painlessly, than turned over for research. Putting it another way, LEGALIZED TORTURE.

It seems the Minister of Agriculture is out to destroy the Humane Society — an organization that has proved its great humanitarian work over the years. I think this bill is a retrograde step.

Bearing in mind an election will soon be called in this Province, let us press to have this bill revoked, or do we intend to stand idly by.

Menu Of Week

Sweet and Sour Chicken
Wings, Creamy Potatoes,
Peas with Diced Turnips,
Raw Carrot Sticks, Rhubarb
Meringue Pie.

Chicken wings slowly
baked in your favorite sweet
and sour sauce are a tasty,
penny-wise choice for
meals. Complete your meal
with an ideal rhubarb pie
topped with frothy peaks of
white meringue — definitely
a winning combination.

RHUBARB MERINGUE
PIE: 1 cup sugar, 3 tbsp
flour, 1/8 tsp. salt, 5 cups
cut rhubarb (3/4-inch pieces),
3 egg yolks, Pastry for
9-inch single crust pie.

MERINGUE: 3 egg
whites, Few grains salt, 6
tbsp. sugar.

1. Combine sugar, flour,
salt, and rhubarb. Mix well.

Allow to stand 30 minutes,
stirring occasionally.

2. Beat egg yolks,
thoroughly mix into
rhubarb mixture.

3. Line pie pan with
pastry. Turn rhubarb into
unbaked pie shell. Bake at
450 degrees F. for 20
minutes. Reduce heat to
350 degrees F., and
continue baking until filling
at center of pie has
thickened, 30 to 40
minutes.

4. Remove pie from oven,
place on a rack and allow to
cool.

5. Make a meringue of
the egg whites, salt, and
sugar. Spread evenly over
pie. Bake at 400 degrees F.
until peaks are lightly
browned, about 5 minutes.

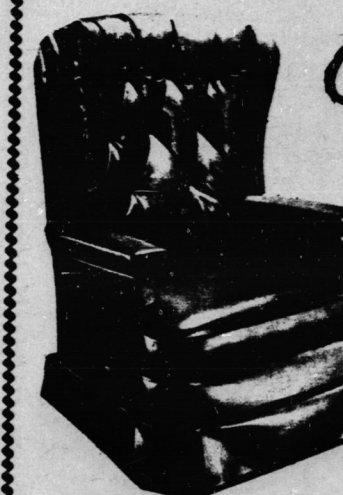
