News From Knowles

MY FRIENDS AND REPORTERS:

The month of May has been a busy one for me. On the occasion, all across the country, for a celebration of the 100th anniversary of the Dutch-Canadian communities. It marked the anniversary of the founding of Holland by our forefathers. In the Dutch-Canadian communities, special programs were arranged for the occasion. I was able to visit two of these communities and when asked what I thought of them, I pointed out that Dutch people have been in this country for over 100 years, including the fact that they have contributed so much to the social and economic development of our country. The dramatic and tangible expression of gratitude, however, is the gift of a new National Arts Centre here in Ottawa. This is financed entirely by donations from Dutch-Canadians, now living in Canada.

On Broadcasts. Last weekend I stayed in Ottawa to attend a Conservative Caucus Conference. The study sessions included a review of our role as an Opposition Party, as well as a study of the internal workings of our caucus. Each Member has an opportunity to express his personal views on a number of wide ranging topics. It enabled the Members to reach agreement on several of the more controversial issues that often come before our caucus. These sessions tend to create a greater spirit of unity and purpose within our Party. I found it very stimulating.

This past week your Member of Parliament made a short speech in the House of Commons in support of an amendment setting up national standards of water quality, which the Opposition felt should be included in the Canada Water Act. The vote on these amendments will come in the next day or two.

New Election Act.

The government has introduced a Bill establishing a new Canada Elections Act, which is due to come up for a clause by clause study in a committee of the whole in the House of Commons. This will affect every Canadian because it includes such items as a lowering of the voting age to eighteen, and the introduction of a new ballot which will indicate the party affiliation of each candidate. It will also permit the use of a check mark in indicating your choice on the ballot.

Cayuga Speedway Race Results

NELLES CORNERS, ONTARIO - Ronnie Martin of Buffalo, N.Y. won the 20 lap Modified-Sportsman Feature here at Cayuga Speedway Friday evening, his first main event victory of his ten year driving career. Martin was chased across the line by Bill Brannard of Cheektawaga, N.Y., Chuck Boos, Lewiston, N.Y., Merv Treichler of Sanborn, N.Y. and his cousin Roger Treichler of N. Tonawanda, N.Y.

Billy Rafter of Nia Falls, N.Y., 20 year veteran driver and many time Stock Car Champion on American and Canadian tracks, jumped into the lead as starter Bob Anderson gave the 21 car field the green, but could only hold on for six laps before his brakes gave out, as Martin took over, and was never headed.

Phil Edwards of Buffalo, N.Y., survived seven caution periods, as the 15 lap Late-Model Feature contest took over one hour to complete. The cars of Billy

Danials, Jim Laughing and Larry Fuller flipped over the guard rail, landing outside the track. Several more were forced out of action in separate crashes, including Norm Forbes of Lockport, N.Y., winner of last week's Late-Model Feature event here. Forbes' crew managed to repair his car in time to return to the action, and he finished in third position, behind runner-up Jim Howard of Buffalo. Ralph Book, Ancaster, Ontario, last seasons L-M Champ here, blew his engine in his qualifying heat, for the second time in as many nights of racing. Then, during a Mod-Stox warm-up, Al Duncan of Hamilton, flipped Bruce Van Dyke's '69 Torino, demolishing it. He was not hurt.

The Mad-Cap Mini-Stox Main event went to last years Champion Larry Anthony of Fisherville, Ontario. Anthony survived the spins, crashes and smashes of the tiny tumbler, but crowd-pleaser Doug Sutton was stuffed into the guard rail and put out of action. Ted Jones of

Kenmore, N.Y., stole the TQ Midget Feature victory from green flag leader Stan Kauwabara of Hamilton on the last turn of the last lap of the 20 lap Main event, as Kauwabara spun his mount trying to pass Jones, who had just taken the lead from him.

The Mod-Stox qualifiers were taken by Pete Hayes and Bill Brannard, and the consolation was won by Wes Stephenson of St. Catharines.

In the Late-Model preliminaries, Edwards and Danials were victors, before Howard copped the consolation. Larry Anthony cleaned house in the Mini's by taking his heat event.

Kauwabara and Harry Macy of Buffalo won the ten lap qualifiers in the exciting TQ Modget events, and Bruce Bolitsky of Waterloo, Ontario, bested all in the last-chance consolation.

Next week, a 50 lap Late-Model Spring Championship will top the 14 event card at the super-fast hi-banked paved oval.
