time in 14 years that all the family and parents had been together.

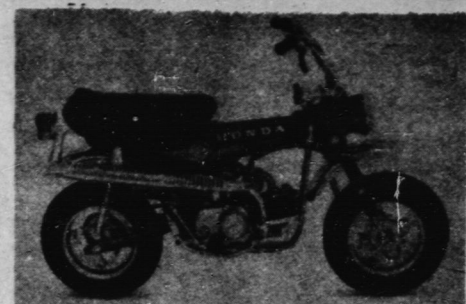
