The Honourable Robert Welch, Ontario's Provincial Secretary and Minister of Citizenship, who opened the conference in the morning, commented on how encouraging it was to see "so much interest expressed by Canadian educators in developing more effective ways of teaching English to speakers of other languages.

Certainly our language and citizenship program is playing a major role in helping newcomers to adapt to their new life in Canada, and any improvements which we can make in this field will ultimately benefit all Canadians", he said.
