## \$\$\$ And Good Sense

 Dear Mr. Martin: I'm a business man who travels rather extensively for my company. Often I've

noticed other men who always seem to take great pride in displaying an accordion-fold of credit cards. I've often wondered how they managed to keep their records and expense sheets straight with a dozen or so credit cards to keep track of. I know I could never do it.

I have no particular problem, Mr. Martin, but I thought I would add my two cents worth to this credit card controversy. I have a suggestion concerning their use... or rather indiscriminate use... and perhaps if more people followed this principle, they might stay out of financial trouble.

I have two credit cards in my possession. One is a well-known card which is acceptable in most every place where credit cards are accepted. I use it almost exclusively. However, even as acceptable as it generally is, there are some hotels and restaurants that don't accept this particular card.

In that case I carry with me a spare credit card, or reserve. It's a credit card that is also generally recognized and accepted. I use it whenever the other one isn't acceptable. And it's very rare when neither of them are accepted.

Using a credit card is just like using cash. You have to be careful or you'll wind up overspending. Mr. C. B.

Thank you very much, Mr. B., for your comments about the credit card. Your plan sounds like a sound one and perhaps some of us will take your advice. As you suggest, you should use it just as you would cash, keeping an accurate record of your spending and making certain that you spend no more than you had intended to spend if you had used cash.

For many other people, however, I would recommend against the use of the credit card. Some people just cannot adjust to the fact that though the credit card will just about purchase anything, anytime and anywhere, the bill must be paid when it comes in. By that time they've probably gotten themselves deep in trouble.

## On The Farm Front

Interested beef producers meet on Thursday evening, May 14, at the Boardroom in the Agricultural Office, Cayuga, to determine the fate of the Haldimand Beef Improvement Association. Graeme Hedley, a native of Haldimand, will be assisting in the discussion.

Graeme has recently left the Livestock Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture and Food to take the position of secretary, the Ontario Beef Improvement Association. Fred Schweyer, R.R.3, Cayuga, leads the Haldimand Hog Quality Competition with an average index of 106.7 on 53 hogs marketed to March 31 of this year. John Vandenberg, R.R.1, Caledonia, realized an average of 103.7 and Ben Elliott, R.R.1, Cayuga, stood third with 102.7.

Wheat producers of the county will be deciding on the proposal that deductions be increased to a maximum of 17 percent in order to finance the sale of surplus Ontario winter wheat. The Haldimand meeting takes place at the Rural Youth and Agricultural Centre, Kohler, May 19, starting at 8 p.m.

Marketing Board members will explain the proposal. This will be followed with an opportunity for qualifying producers to cast their ballot. Obviously, those not in attendance will forfeit the opportunity. Ballots will be counted at Toronto after all county meetings have been held.

Three kinds of parasites that are expected to feed on the alfalfa weevil will be released in two Haldimand locations soon. They are not expected to provide any relief this year so those with alfalfa can start now with periodic checking of their fields for damage.

Cutting early is still the best advice available along with frequent inspections of alfalfa fields. Spraying, because of cost would only be advised where necessary.

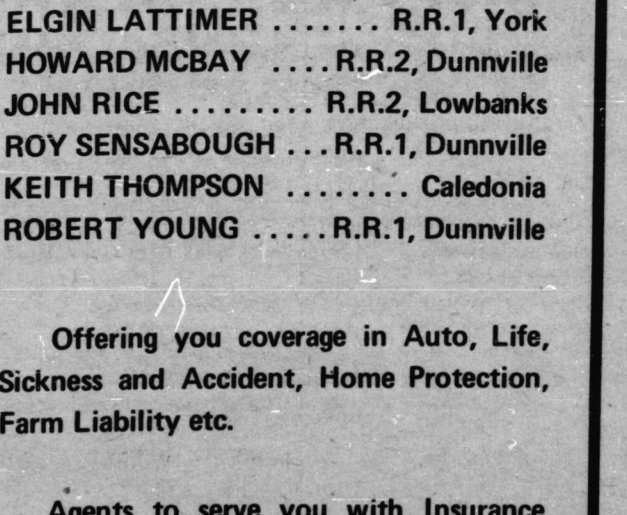
