Film Library Proposed For Haldimand - Norfolk

CAYUGA - A film library is the aim of the Haldimand County Board of Education in a joint program with the Norfolk Board of Education and the separate school board for both counties. The films would be donated by the Ontario Department of Education as well as films that would be bought. Two places for keeping and documenting the films would be needed to supply the area. It was suggested the films would be an aid to

education as well as supplement subject matter in the schools. In other business the board endorsed a resolution from the York County Board of Education asking for "dwelling unit fees" from new developments and subdivisions. This would mean an additional assessment fees on five percent by property owners of newly developed areas, paid to a municipality, which would be paid to school boards in advance. The fee would mean that anyone purchasing a new home in a new subdivision would be leveled the additional tax. The resolution was sent to Education Minister William Davis and Municipal Affairs Minister Darcy McKeeugh. Caledonia, Dunnville and Canboro, secondary students have produced their own home movies to enter the Ontario Department of Education contest. The films were produced by the students on their own time. They also

Propose Haldimand Disposal Area

CAYUGA - Haldimand is still working on getting a county-wide garbage disposal system it was learned at the council session Friday. Under the new proposal 11 of the county's present dumping sites would be used for disposal of brush and dry materials only. They would also be used for pick-up areas from which the material would be transported to the remaining three sites in the county. The three remaining sites would be used for the disposal of the remainder of refuse under a controlled 'dry filled and sanitary landfill operation. Ken Childs, a regional engineer of the Department of Energy and Resources, made recommendations to the council after completing a survey of all dumping areas being operated in the county. He recommended the county be divided into four areas with the Moulton Township site serving 12,000 people; Walpole 8,000; North Cayuga 8,000 and Oneida Township 2,000. It was estimated it would cost county residents \$1.50 each in a year's time. However, even at this figure it would double the rate of many municipalities. Walpole's rate would jump from a total cost of \$500 to \$6,000 annually. Mr. Childs said the main reason for a changeover is because of the pollution problem burning will have to be stopped completely and open dumps will be a thing of the past. In other business council criticized Dr. H. H. Washburn with failing to keep a promise on providing permits to erect septic tanks on lots less than 20,000 square feet.

Some 6,000 people crowded into Jarvis over the holiday weekend to participate in the festivities marking Victoria Day. The huge parade with its floats, old cars and marching bands, stretched over a half mile as it wound its way up the village streets. Some 3,000 lined the streets to watch the parade. Afterwards a good number made their way to the community centre grounds to watch the ball games and a demonstration by the Big Creek Saddle Club. Teenagers 500 strong, took part in a dance at the centre. In the amateur contest held at the centre Monday night different types of talent showed the area has a good cross section of upcoming entertainers. There were 18 winners in the contest, which included displays of skill with musical instruments, singing and dancing. The contest committee for the Jarvis Lions Club said that winners names will be announced next week. One Lions Spokesman summed up the weekend festivities as the biggest since the one for centennial year in 1967, maybe even bigger.

Tax Sale Of Land

The Cayuga Council decided at their meeting on May 4 that all lands any part of three years in arrears of taxes be given to the County Treasurer, as land to be sold for taxes in 1970. The Council will accept the funds, collected now, and to be collected by the Artificial Ice and Recreational Centre Committee, and shall be responsible for the accounting of same, and will undertake to supply the official receipt as necessary. Other business of the evening was issuing a building permit to A. Morgan for a garage, and the paying of accounts.

Policeman Promoted

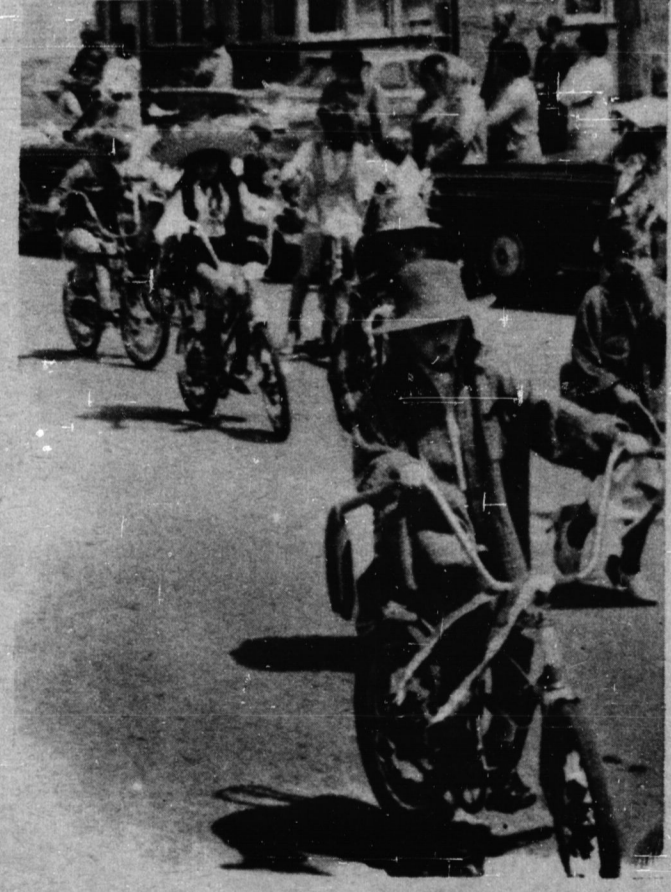
