### Prepare Garden For Annuals - Now

prepare the soil in which nuals are to be planted. The soil, once dug, should have organic matter added in the form of barnyard manure or compost at the rate of 50 to 75 pounds per 100 square feet. Dr. P. M. Harney,

Department of Horticultural Science, University of Guelph, says that peat moss is easy to obtain and may often be used instead of manure or compost. Peat should be spread in a layer one to two inches thick, and worked into the soil.

On fine-testured clay soilsa a 50-20-10 analysis fertilizer may be applied at the rate of 2½ pounds per 100 square feet. For coarse-textured sandy soils, a 50-20-20 analysis fertilizer applied at the same

rate is recommended. Although some enthusiasts grow their own annuals from seeds, says Dr. Harney, many people buy

HOMEBUILT HYDRO NAVADA LAKE, B.C. (CP) - Texan Harvey Walsh, 41, finally gave up on his "dang-fooled" one-cylinder power plant that supplied minimal electricity to his ranch here 18 miles west of Prince George. Last December, power from B.C. Hydro flowed along a 1.9-mile transmission line built by himself at a cost of over \$2,000, a lot of bloody knees and bruised muscles. It took four years to get permission for the unorthodox project, but Walsh thinks it was all worth it - power will now cost about half the \$45-8-month he used to
