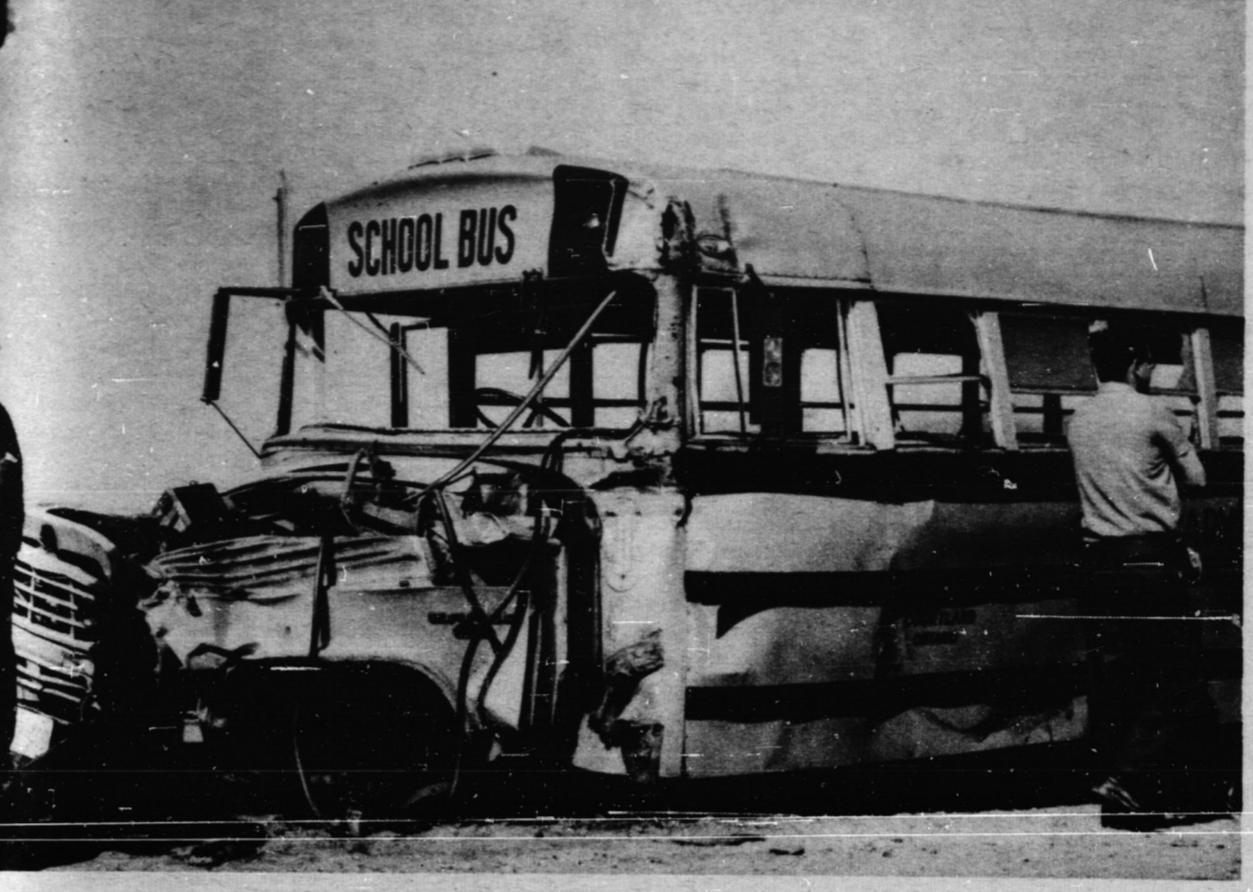

Bus Crash Kills One, Injures 28

Delhi - one girl was killed a bus driver and 27 elementary students were injured in a school bus tractor-trailer crash four miles north of here Tuesday.

Eight ambulances were required to take the injured to the Norfolk General Hospital and the Tillsonburg Memorial Hospital. The separate school bus making its morning pickup of students for the Lady of Fatima School at Courtland was about half loaded when the crash occurred. The bus is owned by the Haldimand-Norfolk Separate School Board.

Residents Ask Halt To Dumping

HAGERSVILLE - Village Council is probing the effect of dumping refuse in a quarry that is situated near a residential area.

A Sarah St. Resident, Ben Auger, told Council the site was within 1,000 feet of his home and requested health authorities be asked to stop the dumping.

He said the refuse would pollute a small lake in the quarry and provide a breeding ground for rats.

The quarry is owned by Canada Crushed and Cut Stone Ltd.

In other business Chief Ray Holden told Council the Village garbage truck was a disgrace.

It had no signal lights, weak brakes, cracked windshield and a cracked mirror, he said.

Reeve Lyle Furry quipped: "I was going to ask if the truck was speeding."

Council decided to look into the matter.

Coun. Ross Sloaf complained that he was inquiring whether radar was used at night at the last Council session when he was reported as saying it was used.

He said he has since asked Chief Holden whether it was and received a satisfactory answer.

Residents Ask Halt To Dumping

Dead is Margaret Vriend, 13, a grade eight student and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Vriend of R. 3 Delhi.

Bus driver, Leslie Otto of Courtland, is reported in fair condition in Tillsonburg Hospital.

Police said the driver said that the brakes failed at the intersection of Con. 11 and Highway 59 where the crash occurred.

The Transport driver, Robert Mayer, of Woodstock said he couldn't stop his heavily laden truck in time to avoid a collision. The bus crashed into the right side of the transport right at its fuel tanks and then swerved around and the rear of the bus crashed into the trailer of the truck.

A third vehicle, which was approaching just as the bus and truck collided, swerved and crashed into a ditch. The driver, Murray Waum, said he saw the bus approaching the intersection and onto the Highway without stopping.

Ten students and the bus driver were still in hospital today. Some of them on the critical list. Damage to the vehicles has been estimated at \$10,000. Tillsonburg OPP investigated the crash, which occurred about 8:20 a.m.
