#### Inquest Scheduled Into Crash

NORWICH - An inquest has been scheduled June 19 to inquire into the school bus crash May 28 on

The crash claimed the lives of two elementary students and sent most of the other passengers on the bus to hospital The bus was carrying 30 passengers to Our Lady of Fatima School in Courtland.

The bus was eastbound on Con. 11 of South Norwich and hit a transport-trailer that was south bound on Highway

The hearing will be held at the North Norwich Township office.

Two of the students of the 28 injured in the crash are still in hospital. Both are reported in good condition. A third was released from hospital yeaterday.

The victims of the crash were Margaret Vriends, 13, and Violet Besenyodi, 12, both of R.R.3, Delhi.
