used by the Norfolk and Western Railway, which has fast and frequent trains using the line that crosses at that

One fatality has already occurred at the crossing when a hydro truck collided with a train.

A spokesman for a train crew in St. Thomas told The Record his crew has had many close calls at the crossing. His words were: "we're going to kill somebody at that

It may be argued that vision is clear for nearly a mile at the crossing. However, it is usually the drivers that are thinking about something else that will be the ones to

A signal device would possibly bring an approaching train to their attention.

The most northerly line goes through to Hamilton The southerly line is the main line to Fort Erie.

The time to get protective signals at the crossings is now - not after another fatality occurs.


