This was the concept of Marie Slaght, valedictorian of the Hagersville Secondary School annual commencement exercises Saturday.

She was speaking to some 100 students, parents and teachers attending.

She told the students — especially the older students — they should keep up their efforts to keep "feelings of unity, friendship, brotherhood and compassion."

"We held out our hands in friendship to fellow classmates and gave assistance when possible."

"Our student's council on behalf of the rest of us presented equipment to the W.H.G. Hospital and the

school for retarded children. But we can't stop here."

"Into our future lives we must take all these feelings. Surely what is possible to achieve in a body of 800 can be extended to the whole world," she said.

She emphasised no matter what field each person chooses to work that if these ideals are upheld the type of world we are aiming for may become a reality.

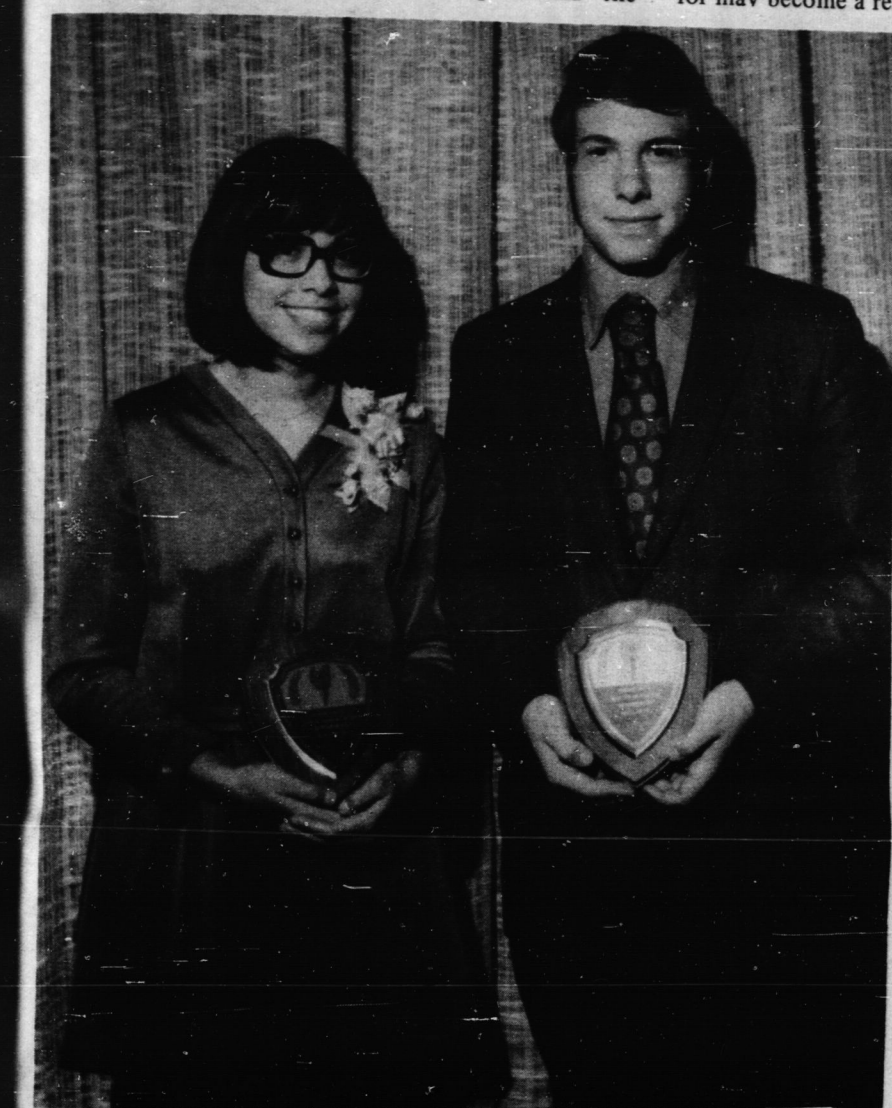
