A feature topic at a recent meeting of the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture was the Norfolk-Haldimand study recommendations.

The Federation members discussed the need for consideration of 85 percent of all land in the county expected to remain in agriculture production. Members were particularly interested in land zoned for farming immediately adjacent to proposed development areas.

Farm operators could be seriously affected through inconvenience and restriction of their operations because of their location and depressed land values as compared to land used for development.

The Federation recommends the study committee support recommendations of the committee on assessment and taxation which is a committee appointed by the provincial government.

The recommendations are that prime agricultural land not be assessed for more than \$200 an acre. Other land of less value should be scaled down from this figure as long as it is being used for agriculture.

This has been a sought after formula of the Federation of Agriculture. The Ontario Federation is taking some credit for a 25 percent reduction in property tax for farmers recently announced by Ontario. It is now essential that these recommendations be implemented to avoid a possibility of having taxes force farmers off their land in these developing counties.

It was the consensus of the meeting to congratulate the study committee on the amount of effort that was made in preparing the suggested plans. The meeting also emphasized the urgency in getting all people in the two counties to one of the open meetings being held in the area. These are designed to inform and hear the views of the residents. The huge development expected in the area is probably going to have a big effect on everyone.

The two remaining meetings in Haldimand are scheduled for Dunnville on October 28 and Jarvis Nov. 11.
