Lack Of Versatility

TORONTO (CP) - The employment problems encountered by some PhD graduates in science may arise from the degree-holder's lack of versatility, says the new president of the Canadian Society for Chemical Engineering.

Dr. William M. Campbell said in an interview that many science PhDs too often insist in remaining in their post-graduate specialty when they enter industry.

"You hear comments from industry that they are not interested in PhDs; they are more interested in bachelors or masters."

He said that if a bachelor's or master's degree-holder can do a job, a PhD should be able to do the job even better - "if he was willing to get in there and take it on."

Dr. Campbell, 55, became president of the 2,000 member chemical engineering society at the group's recent conference in Sarnia, Ont. He is manager of industrial applications for the Chalk River nuclear laboratories of Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd.

He hopes the society will be able during his term of office to promote interaction between universities and the chemical engineers.

"What is needed," he said, "is more flow of people. University professors should get out of the universities for periods and spend time in industry."

Dr. Campbell holds degrees from the University of Toronto, Case Institute of Technology in Cleveland and the University of Illinois in Chicago.

He has worked for Shawinigan Chemicals of Montreal, now a division of Gulf Oil Canada Ltd., and taught in the chemical engineering department of Queen's University, Kingston, Ont.

Dr. Campbell began to work for Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd. in 1950. During the first 15 years of his employment with the federal Crown corporation he was at Chalk River, where he was director of the chemical and metallurgy division.

He was director of research for the Ontario Research Foundation at Sheridan Park, a centre near Toronto supported by industry and the Ontario government, from 1965 until his recent return to the AEC.
