## Stelco - 'Blow Instead Of Boom'



W. E. Austin has been a blow to the area so far of a boom. It is the opinion of business people and authorities in an area Record survey shows that many firms have suffered

because of the loss of commerce from farmers that were located on the shore of Lake Erie and south of Highway 3 but sold their properties to industry. Many opinions show that so far the announcement of the location of Stelco in the area has inflated land prices as well as taken away business from established firms.

He said all that the two big proposed industries have accomplished for the community so far is to bring up the price of property. "We can certainly notice the lack of commerce from farmers which we did have who were located on the sites purchased by Stelco and Texaco," said Mr. Austin.

Walpole Township council and Stelco representatives. Stelco representatives, Ron Booth, Graham Wright and Harvey Polk said no date could be fixed for opening the Nanticoke site. A tentative date for construction of roads was 1973, and plant construction in 1974 and possible production in 1976-77.

Reeve Gordon Miller said one of the bright spots about the situation at present is that Stelco has indicated that when it does get started it will be much more extensive than was planned originally. "However, it certainly has hurt small business firms of the area dependent on selling farm supplies. It has also hurt from the standpoint of inflated property values," said Mr. Miller.

Reeve John Kincaid of Hagersville said Stelco is definitely serious about locating in the area and we have to think about the benefits to come and not the hurt of area economy of terms of water, air and other facilities.

He told council that air pollution regulations for proposed heavy industry along Lake Erie will be pretty tough. He said that each municipality in the area under phase one of planning will accept the maximum number of new people for which its facilities can provide.

"The three places easiest to enlarge are Caledonia, Dunnville and Port Rowan because of their close proximity to the lake." "Under phase two a new community will be required with a population of 100,000 people," he said.

However, under questioning he said this proposed community could be attached to an existing community especially if water and sewer facilities are piped to the inland communities.

He emphasised that there are practically no vacant houses available in the area now.

## Jarvis Taxes Rise Slightly

JARVIS - Village ratepayers will pay slightly higher taxes under a new mill rate set by council.

The rate is up about one mill for public school residential taxpayers and about 15 mills for public school commercial.

Separate school residential and commercial are up about the same.

This means the average resident with a tax bill of \$300 will have an increase of \$10 per thousand dollars of assessment.

Clerk Robert Lysch said the increases came from an increase in both the county and the education levies for the Village. The education levy was increased by \$7.700.

Eric Grove, assistant planning consultant of a Haldimand-Norfolk study for Ontario, gave an updated report on projected development in the area in the next 15 years.

He said part of the study was to determine what natural resources are in terms of water, air and other facilities.

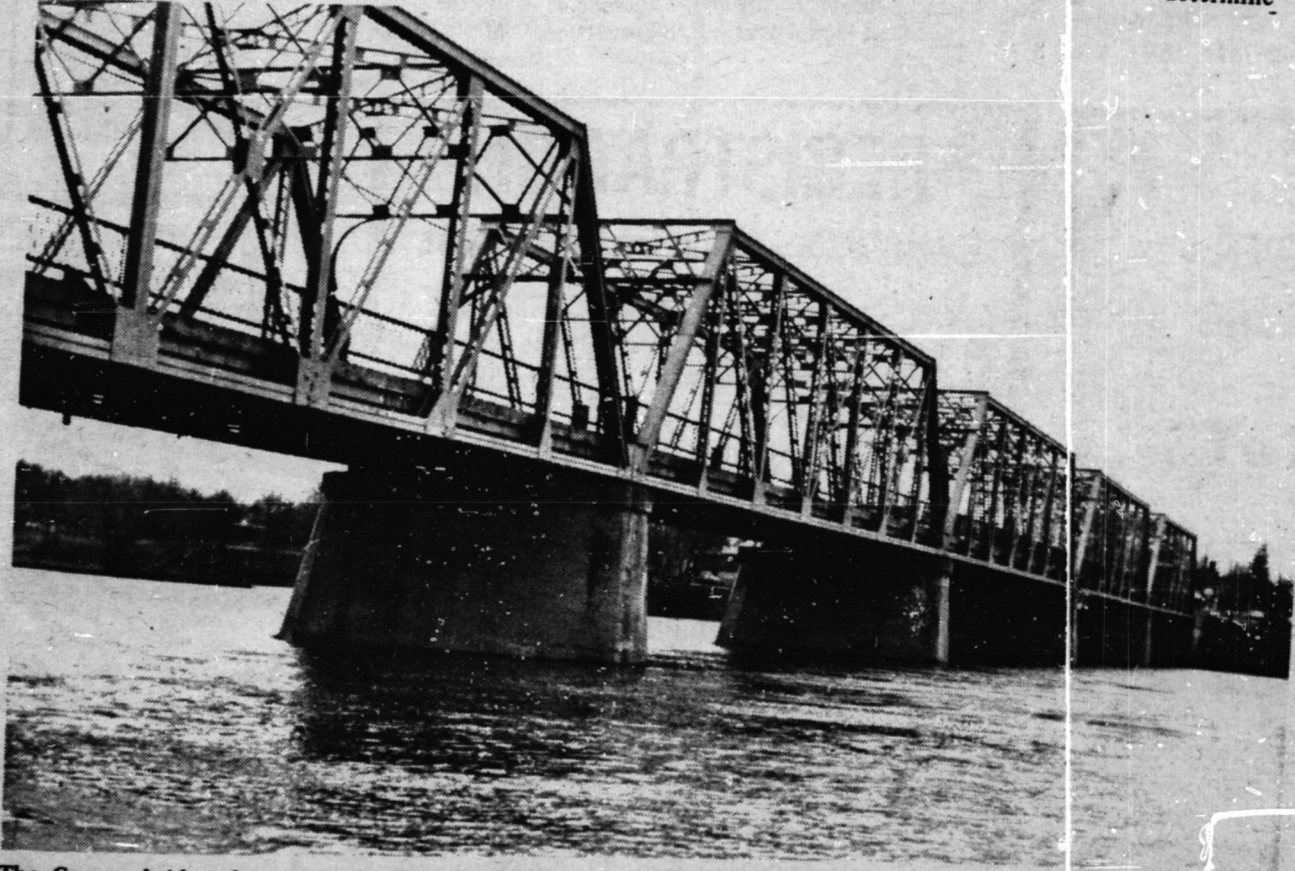
