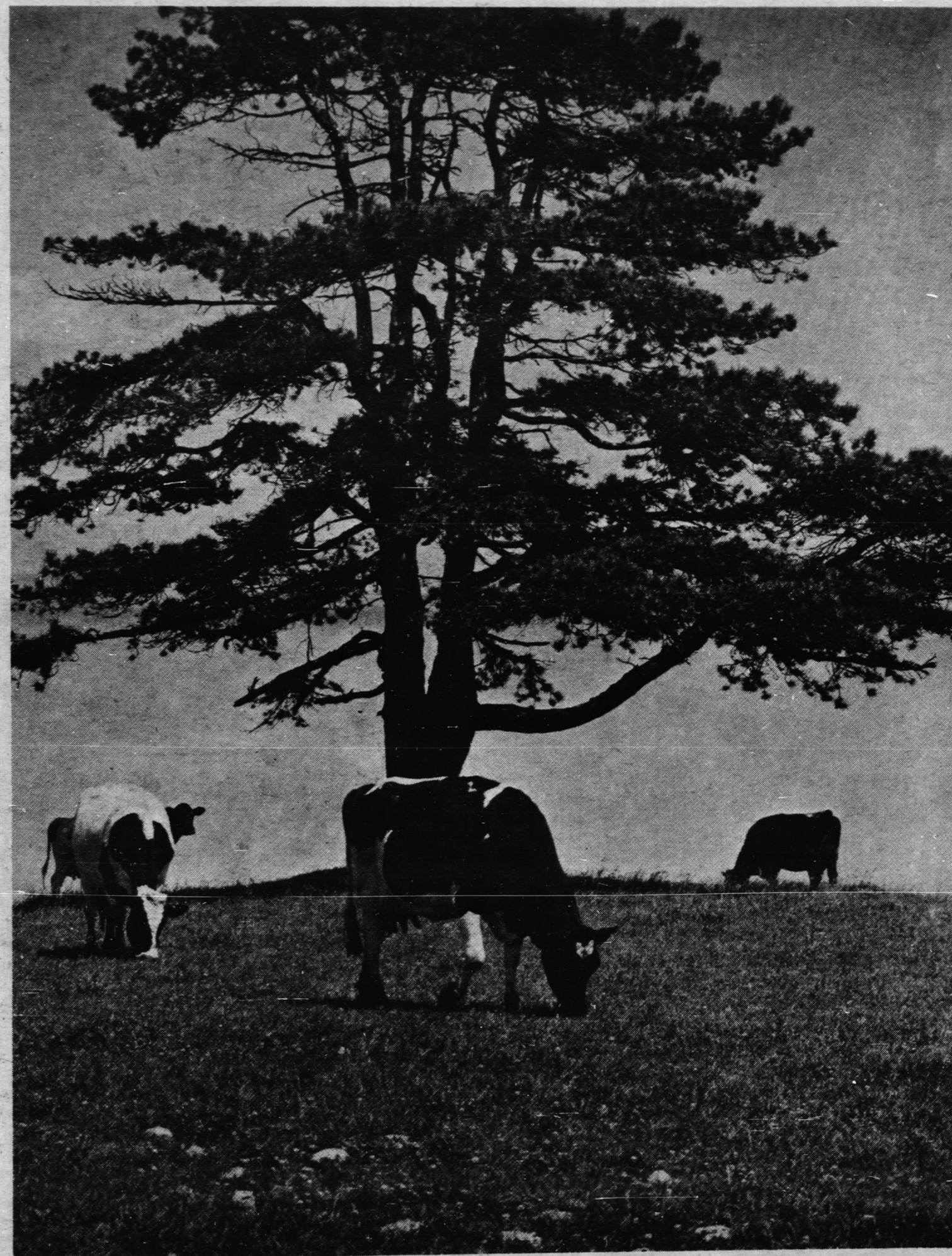
Chairman Harvey Bassindale held a minute of silence in memory of the late Lorne Doughty, former Walpole Progressive and esteemed citizen of Township.
