WHAT DOES THIS DATE MEAN?

The other day, as I was going over some old papers, I found a copy of the Montreal Daily Star of May 7, 1945. What happened on that day? Why did I keep it so long? All across the front page is printed just two words: - "GERMANY QUITS."

This is printed in letters 2 1/2 inches high, and beside it a large photo of Winston Churchill making the Victory sign. A great deal of the rest of the paper is filled with a description of the German surrender and of the celebrations in Montreal.

The large display ads in the paper all contain patriotic or thankful messages in place of the usual matter. Here is what the Bank of Montreal said: "We join with all Canadians in giving thanks for the Victory in Europe which has delivered us from the perils of dictatorial domination and brutal ruthlessness. Our heartfelt thanks go out to all our fighting men who by their courage, devotion and sacrifice, have once again made us all proud to be called Canadians."

"The greatest war in history ended today with the unconditional surrender of Germany." The surrender was made to General Eisenhower, in Reims, France, by Col. Gen. Jodl, Chief of Staff for the German Army. The Star comments that the surrender really began with withdrawal of the Nazis from Norway and goes on to say: "The end of the European warfare, greatest, bloodiest and costliest war in human history (it claimed at least 40,000,000 casualties on both sides in killed, wounded and captured) came after five years, eight months and six days of strife that overspread the world." It all began with the German invasion of Poland in September 1939.

In the same issue of the Star is an article describing the gathering of the diplomats at San Francisco where 48 nations met together to make plans for what was to become the United Nations, which was formally set up on October 24, 1945, and last year celebrated its first 25 years of existence and this year, with the admission of China, can really claim to be the "United Nations." Its history is chequered with successes and failures but we must keep it alive, it is our chief defence against a Third World War.
