

### Review Heating At Hall

The Community Hall Board met last Thursday in the Board room at the hall. Robert Nixon, chairman called the meeting to order. Present were Elmo Field, secretary-treasurer, who read the minutes. Murray Fleming, Mrs. R. A. Miller, Bruce Miller and Klaus Druyff. Councillor Oldham was absent as he was working. Custodian Warren Keen and Howard Elliott reported on the condition of the furnace. Mr. Elliott stated he had gone over the heating unit thoroughly and had repaired a small fan. He

stated the furnace was in fair condition but old and recommended that the pipes be cleaned now. This would be a two day job for two men.

No decorating was considered until pipes were cleaned. A new furnace was indicated for next year, at which time a change should be made from oil to gas.

A larger chimney opening was indicated and a three unit combination furnace would forestall the difficulty of one furnace failure.

Custodian Keen reported that some dishes and cutlery were needed to bring the total up to setting tables for 300.

Mrs. Miller was to contact Jack Cooke and order additional table supplies. The subject of loaning tables for community projects was left to the Custodian's discretion. He is to be responsible for their return.

Insurance, hydro, heaters, water, sewers and gas were checked and the condition of the hall was found to be good.
