The Hagersville Juniors put good back-to-back efforts together for the first time this year and came up with a win and a tie. Last Thursday, playing before a noisy home town crowd, the boys trounced the Ancaster Shamrocks by a score of 8-5.

Glen Hewson paced the attack for the home team scoring three goals for his first hat trick this season. For his effort he will receive a new hat from Hobbs Men Wear compliments of Sote Transport.

Mark Steele playing his first game in over a week took two periods to get untracked but when he did he banged in two goals. Paul Phibbs, Terry Fryett and Jim Lamb got single goals to round out the scoring. Fryett had three assists to go with his goal with John Kincaid picking up assists on both of Steeles goals.

Ron Foster played a sound two way game and figured in the scoring with two points. Hewson, Lamb, Spies, McKeen, Otterman and Almond picked up assists for the most productive point night the Juniors have had since they played Simcoe.
