#### County Backs Hagersville

CAYUGA (Staff) threw its unanimous support behind Hagersville's bid to have a Lake Erie water pipeline.

Council, meeting Friday, urban municipalities in the county join with the village in requesting the Ontario Water Resources Commission consider a water supply to Haldimand from Lake Erie.

The supply of fresh water to Hagersville has been a recuring theme for some time and Reeve Kincaid and the village council have been making a concerted effort recently to seek a water pipeline supply from the

read to Hagersville council last week, noted an enlarged intake is being constructed at the Ontario Hydro generating site on Lake Erie to eventually accommodate a water supply pipeline, but that at present there was no indication that a pipeline

would actually be built. Reeve Kincaid told county council the intake is being built, but "we'll have to keep after them. We can't let it die. Not only does Hagersville need the water but there are problems in Walpole with wells going
