The agriculture outlook conference of 1971 has ended and the experts have made their predictions for 1972. The picture is not very bright as farmers will produce more for fewer dollars than they did in 1971. That will make the cost of farm inputs most important in the coming year. Haldimand Federation of Agriculture had this in mind when they named the committees for the coming year and established a new inputs committee to concern itself with input costs. The committee is composed of Gordon Booker, chairman, Roy Hagan and Allan Murray.

Pollution is everyone's concern and problems develop quickly, sometimes real and sometimes imaginary. The committee

on pollution is Avery Evans, chairman; Gordon Booker, Earl Deamude and Jim Mitchell.

Rural development as it affects farmers must be watched continually. The committee for this is: Marc Stephenson, chairman; Ralph Gowan, Russell Smith, Maurice Yager and Bert Stam.

The property committee attempts to advise in matters of expropriation, taxation, assessment and other affects to property. In 1972 this chore falls on Otto Crone, chairman, George Ramsey, Orin Rittenhouse and Jim Louks.

Insurance needs change continually and to represent farmers in this area and to be a liaison with C.I.A.G. are Ray Cowie, chairman, Orin Rittenhouse, Ken Anderson, Grant Temple and the Co-op chairman.

On The Farm Front

CAYUGA - High yield in the 1971 Soybean Competition conducted by Haldimand Soil and Crop Improvement Association was 47.8 bushels grown by Harvey Schumacher, R. R. 1 Fisherville. Harold Bradford, Dunnville, also grew over 40 bushels per acre. Other awards presented recently were to Wayne Burgess, Hagersville, Wayne Ettinger, Dunnville and Larry Brenzil, York.

Top yield in the Barley High Yield Competition was produced by Don Forbes, Caledonia, with 83.9 bushels. Wayne Burgess was second with 81.7. Yields over 75 bushels were produced by Otto Crone, Hagersville, Vernon Nie, Cayuga, Rodney Fox, Cayuga and Arthur Bradford, Dunnville.

Harold Clapp, dairy cattle specialist, advises that there is no delay at the present time for those enrolling on R.O.P. for dairy cattle.

Income Tax filing time is still some months away but this year's "Tax Management" time ends on Dec. 31. Where it is good business to do so, purchases or sales can be made to bring the farm income in line.

Canfarm participants will have a tax print-out that can be used for guidance in this kind of decision. In any case a set of records is important. Main advantages that Canfarm records have is the automatic sorting and calculation done by the computer. This advantage can be assumed only if the farm journal is completed and forwarded in time.

The presentations at the recent Junior Farmer Banquet included those for the livestock judging, Junior Plowing Match, and annual Junior Farmer awards. Judging awards included high score - Wayne Burgess; girl with the highest score -

Paula Gee; swine - Lynn Bilton; Beef - Allan Hedley. Novice winner for 1971 - John Hussack. Junior Champions at the Plowing Match were: Oneida - Craig Huffman; Haldimand - Bruce Peart. The Walker Hedley Award to the outstanding Junior Farmer was won by Rodney Fox. The outstanding Junior Farmer girl, Paula Gee, was presented with the William Knowles Trophy. Peggy Cruickshank was the winner of the J. N. Allan Trophy (highest standing in dairy cattle judging).

Snowden and her decorated committee completed an excellent job of decorating with Christmas trees while red and white tinsel and holly graced the net-skirted well in which crystal ball turned above the water fountain. The evening ended with a buffet.

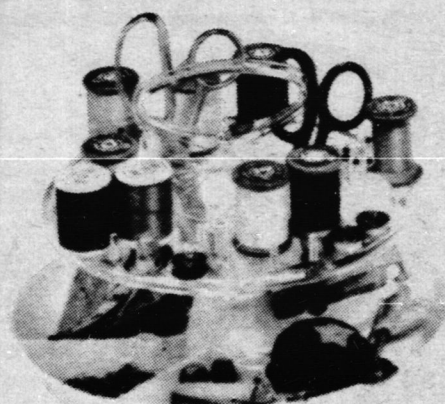

Mr. Saunders leaves many relatives and friends in this area where his family were pioneers, establishing their home on Con. 3 Walpole as early as 1834.

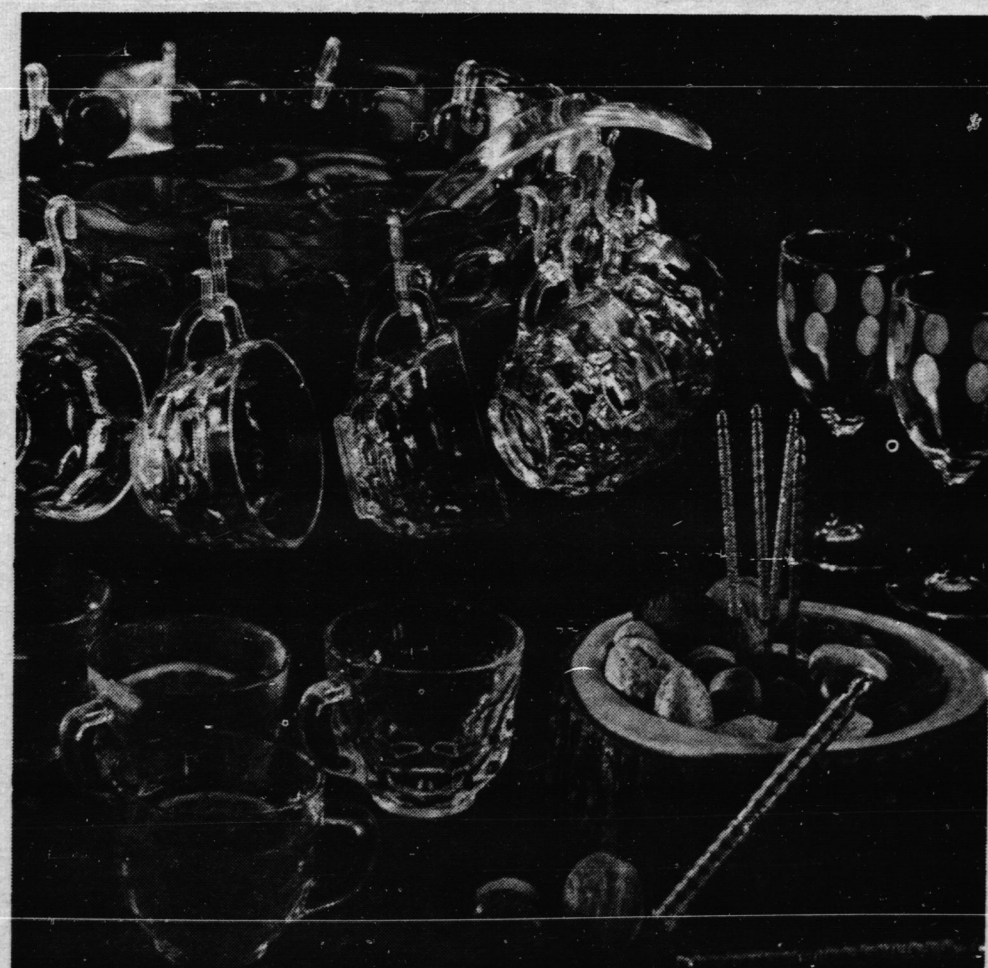
STAR BEEF

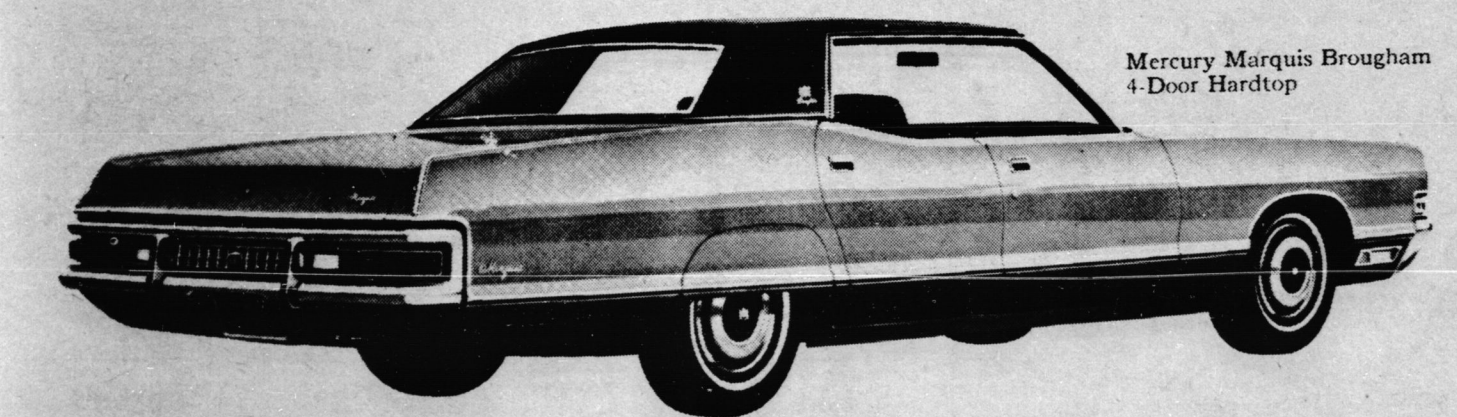
