inter. Kincaid said the village doesn't have a problem as such. "There are only four welfare cases in the area and 'we are doing best with them.'"

Maple Leaf Milling has been hit with a 30 to 75 per cent increase in the cost of electricity to close down its mill.

The business assessment came from a ruling by the Ontario Municipal Board and will increase the taxes by \$1,180 a year for a total of about \$10,000.

Mr. Kincaid said he felt the firm just isn't doing business volume to be able to carry the increased taxes. He said the firm employs about 40 or 45 persons, but the "seed business is going off."

The London PUC has an offer to Hagersville to buy its hydro bills at 15 per cent. Clerk Roth said no costing or savings had been calculated but that would try to determine

the efficiency and economy of the hydro and water bills being prepared at a data centre.

Coun. Robert Gedyes recommended the village go with the proposal. He said it would be a good way to pick up extra man hours needed by the clerk and his staff. "While a computer never saves any money, it is faster and more accurate."

He said such a move would not replace anyone on the staff, but that it would be a way to "get more time to do other work. As it is we may still have to increase our help along with some mechanization."

Clerk Roth said that some day the village will have to go to a monthly billing (instead of every two months) and at that time it might be practical.

Chief Burger said the overall police picture is "pretty good. We are in the process of going to all the town businessmen, getting their names, addresses and phone numbers in case we have to call them on some emergency. The public is taking a good attitude towards this."

The chief suggested to council he send them reports every three months, rather than the monthly report. He felt that a three-month comparison would be of greater benefit to council than a monthly report.

In other police matters, council was informed of an arbitration hearing regarding the police department will be held in the council chambers on Monday, Jan. 24 at either 10 a.m. or 2 p.m.

They were Mr. McKecher, from the western counties; Ron Martin, of Echo Bay, for Ontario's north; Mr. Langman, for the central counties; and Charles Huffman, of Harrow, who was re-elected as one of the three at-large directors on the 12-man board.

Opening the two-day annual meeting was President McCutcheon. He indicated that the increasing size of UCO, plus its determination to continue to serve "the young farmer who is trying to carve out a niche for himself and his family," has resulted in an
